My dog can jump.

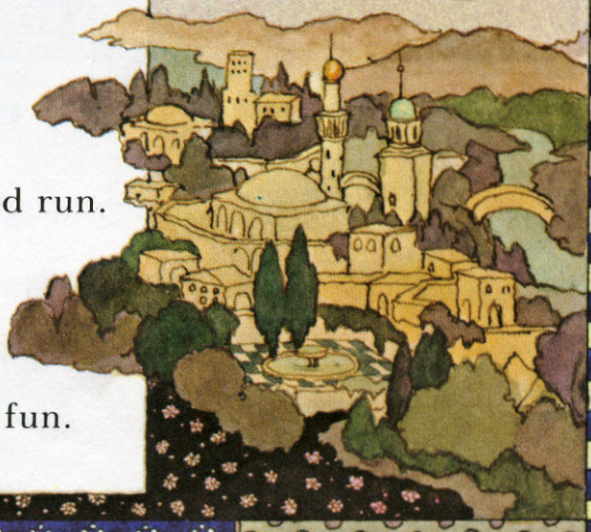
My dog can jump.

My dog can play and run.

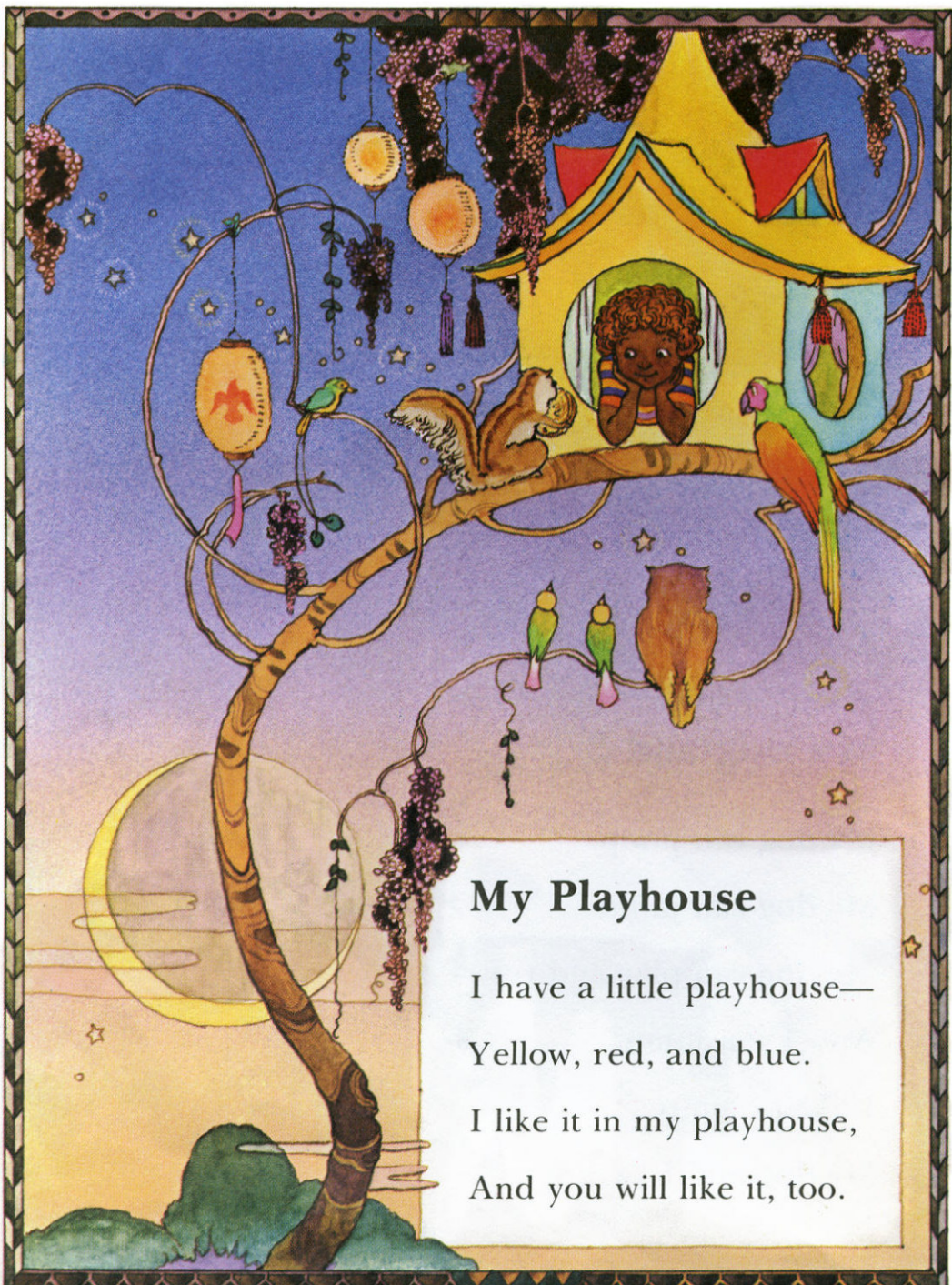
And I can jump.

My dog and I have fun.



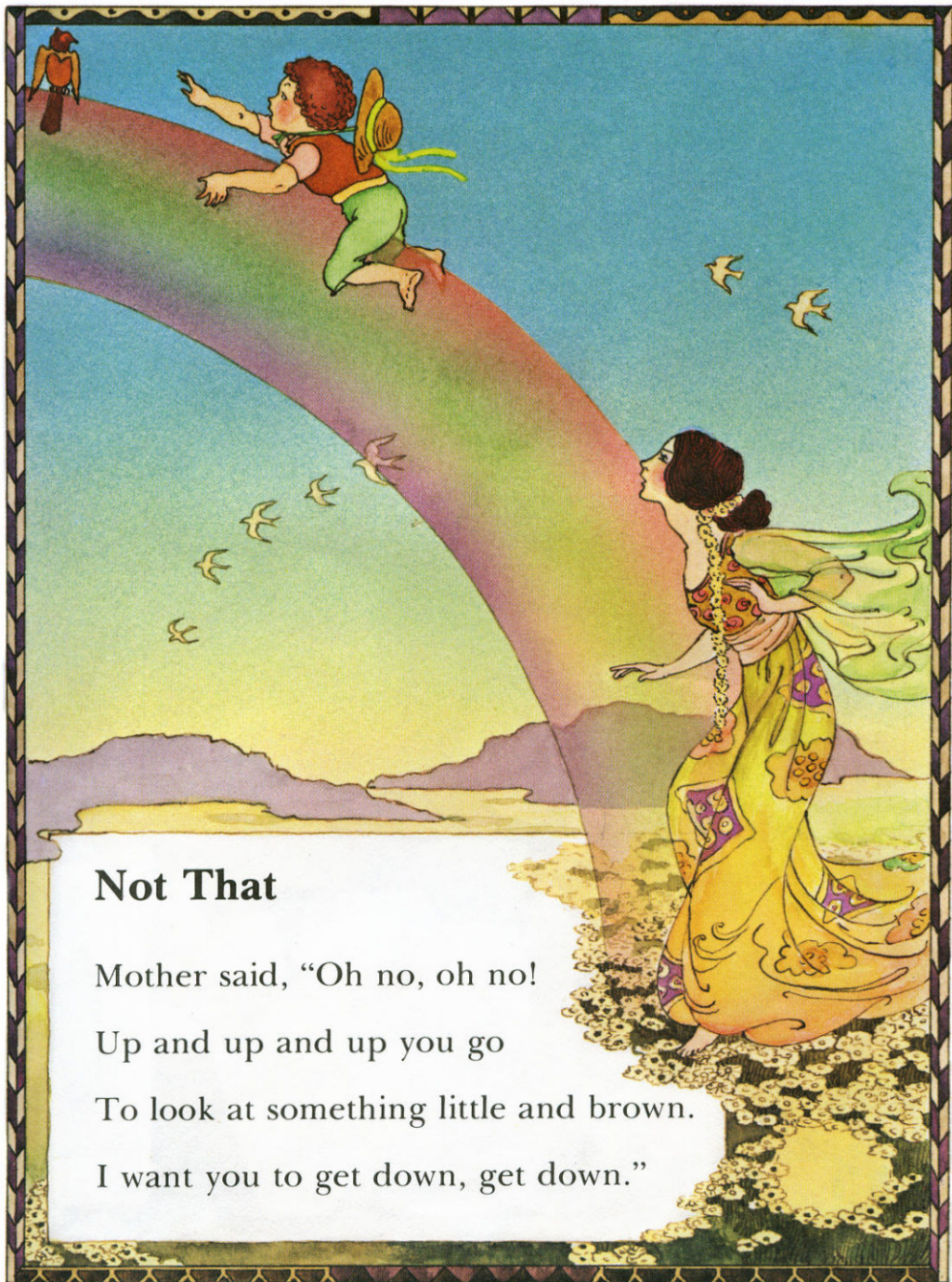




## My Playhouse

Look and see.

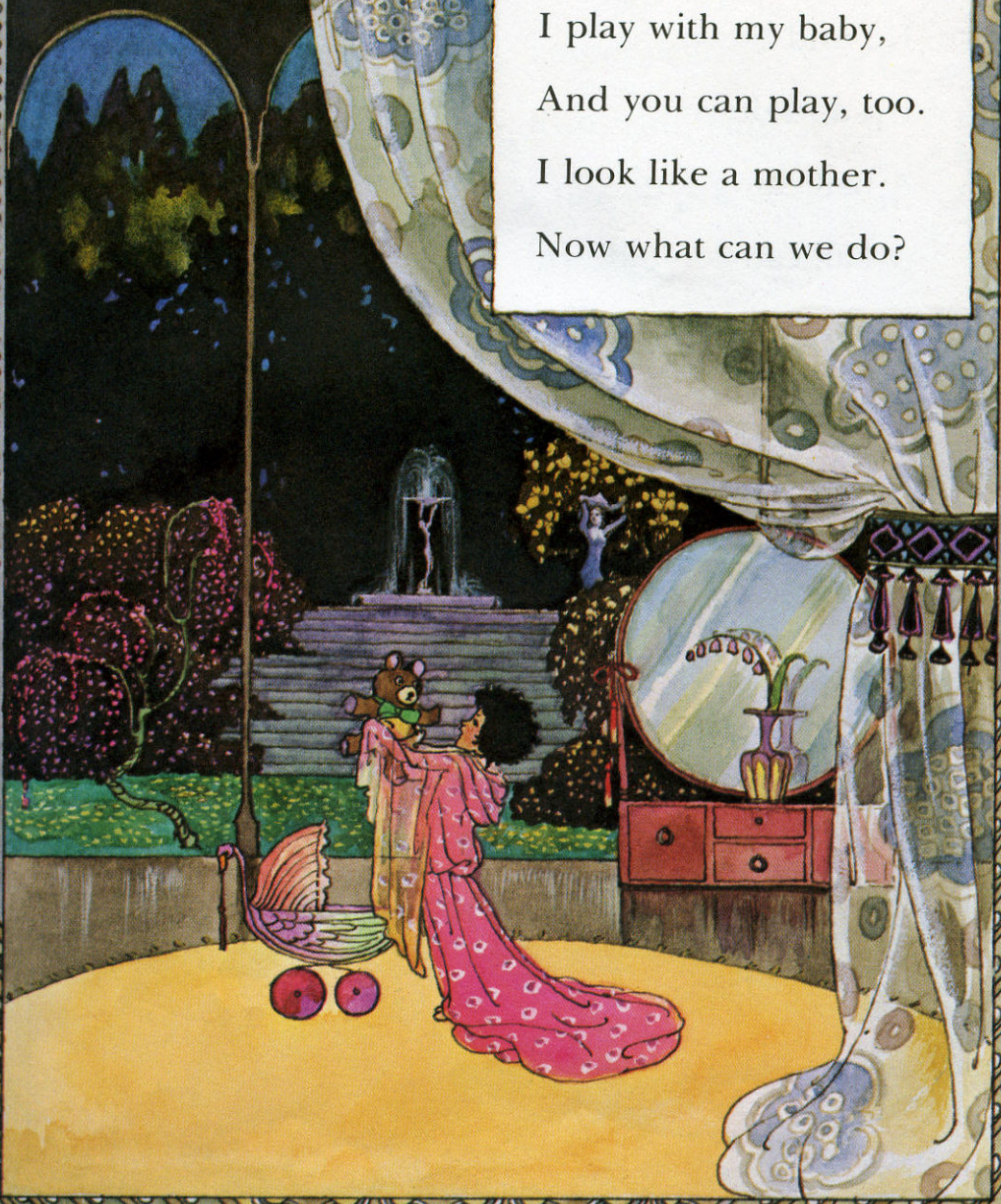
Up, up, up.

Run, run, run.

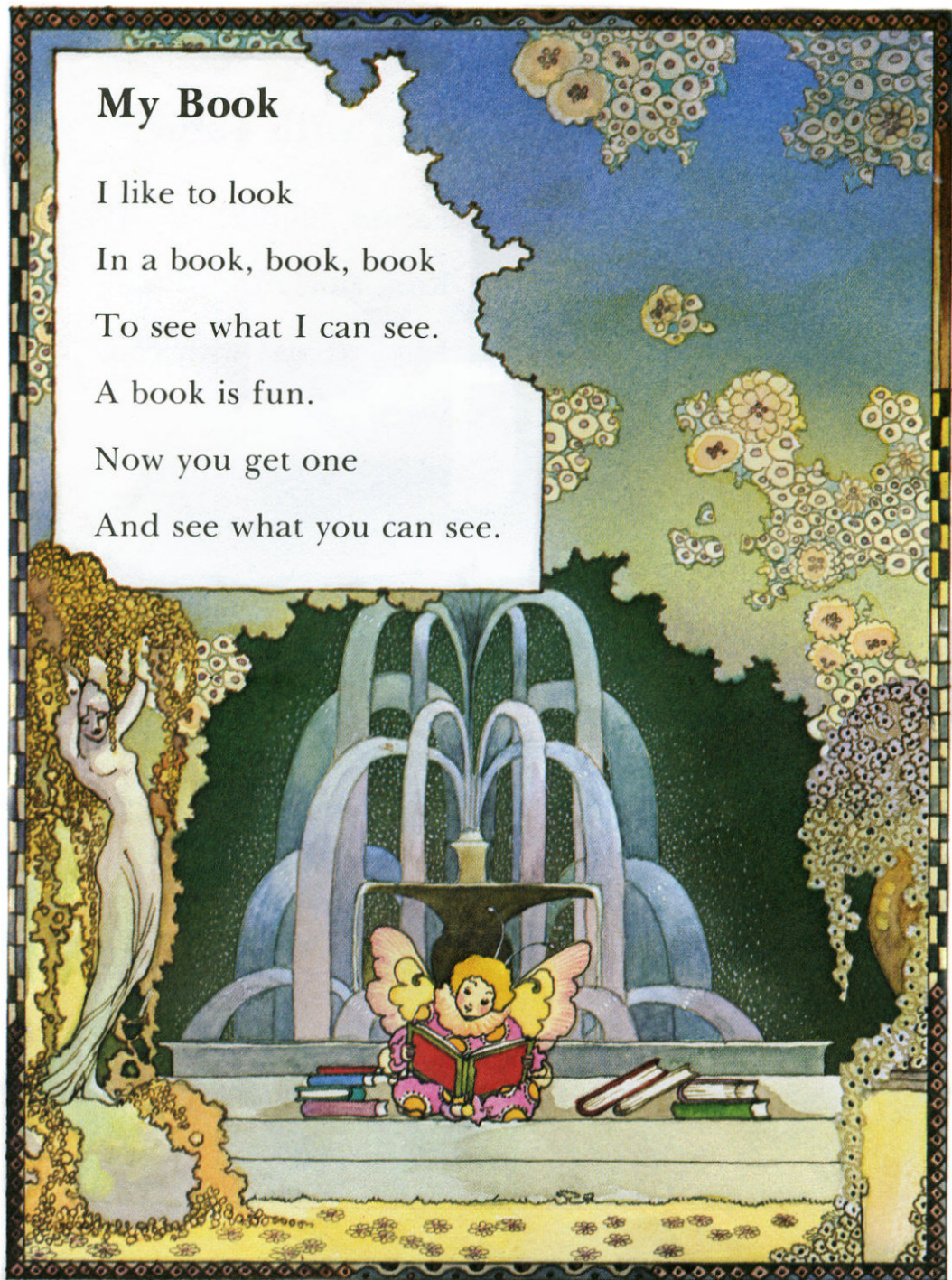
I like to play with you.

The boat can go.

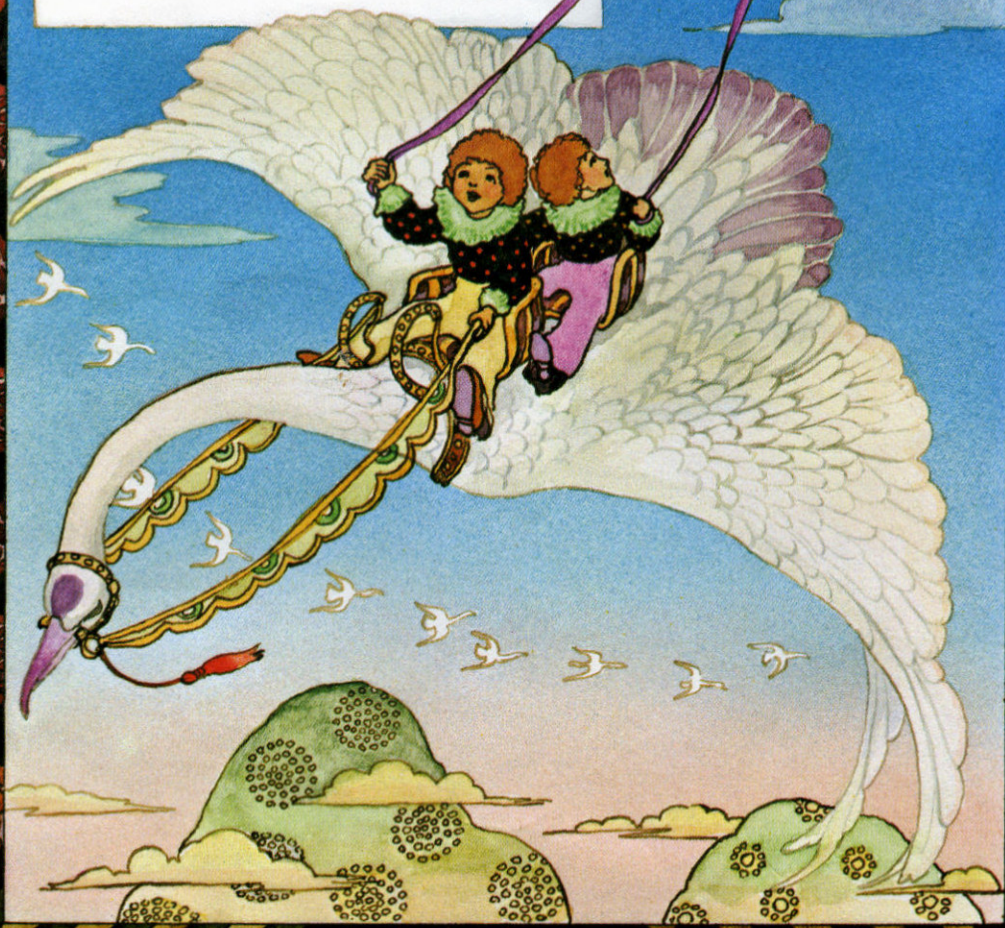
Go, go, go.

Jump a little.

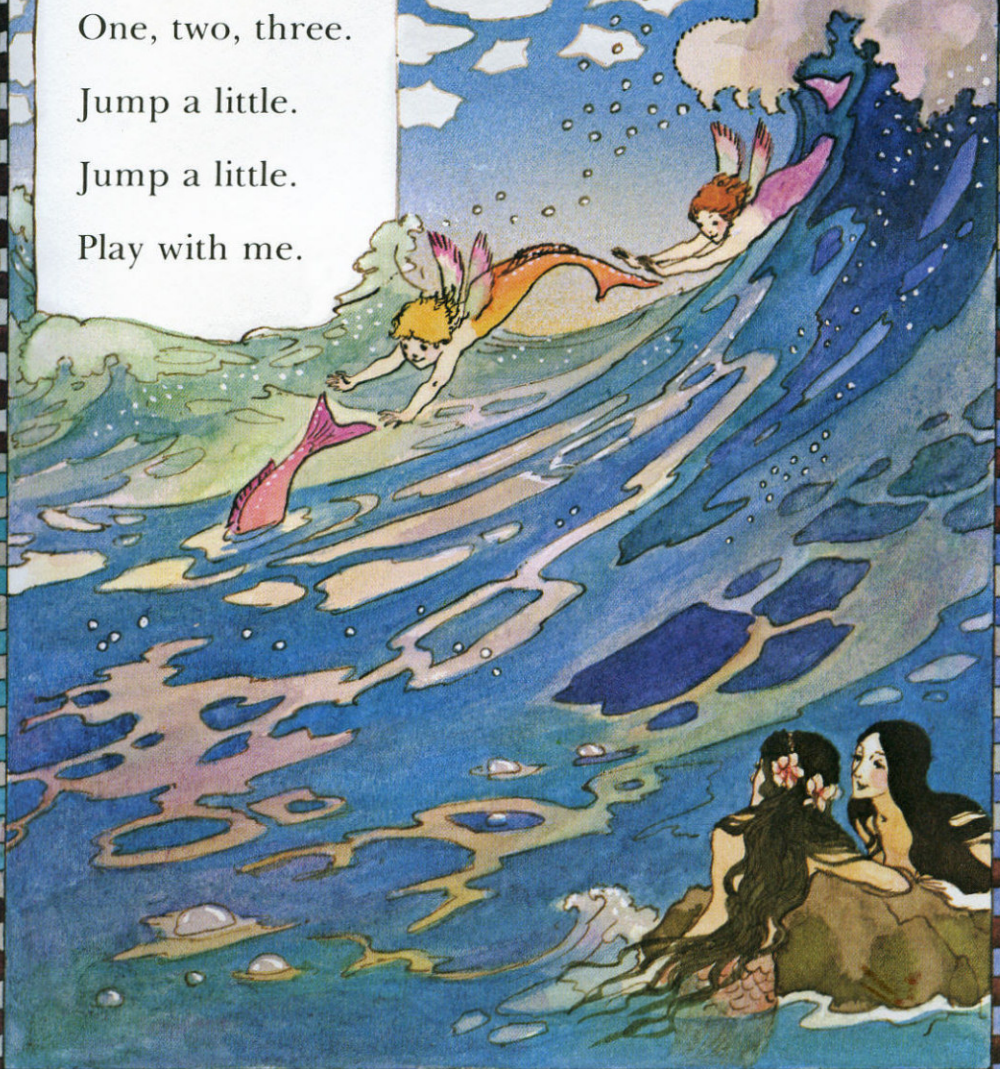
Jump a little.

Play with me.





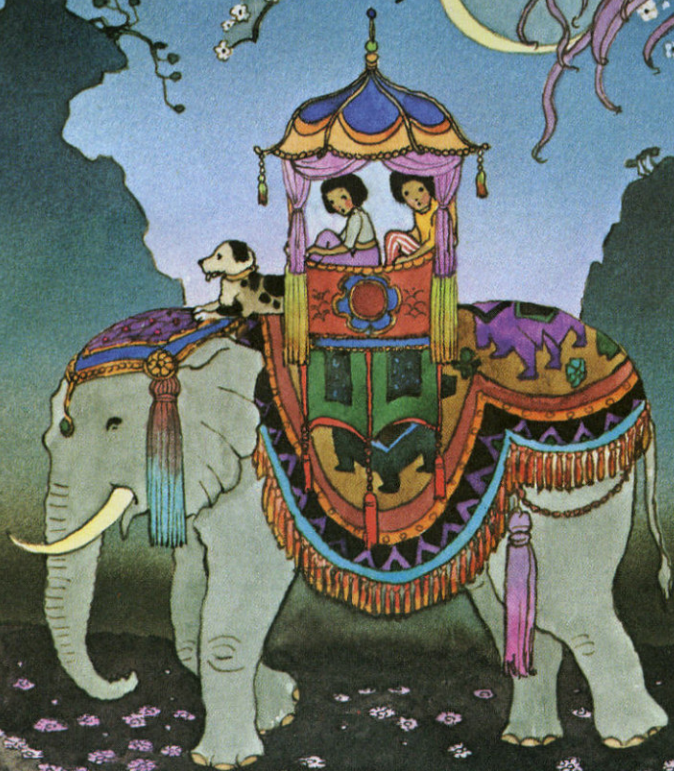
## Ride

I like to ride. Do you?

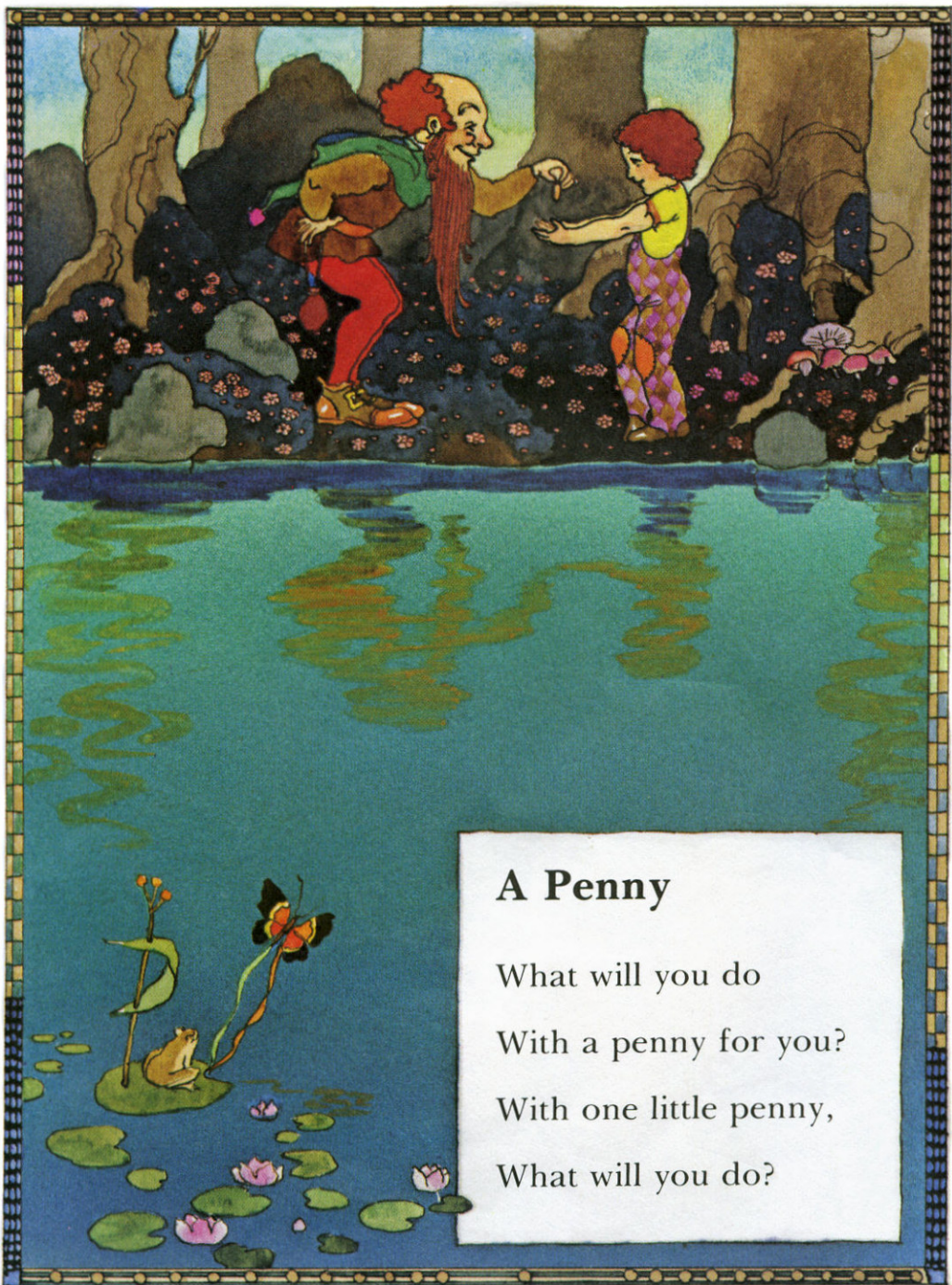
I like to ride with you,

And play. Oh, my.





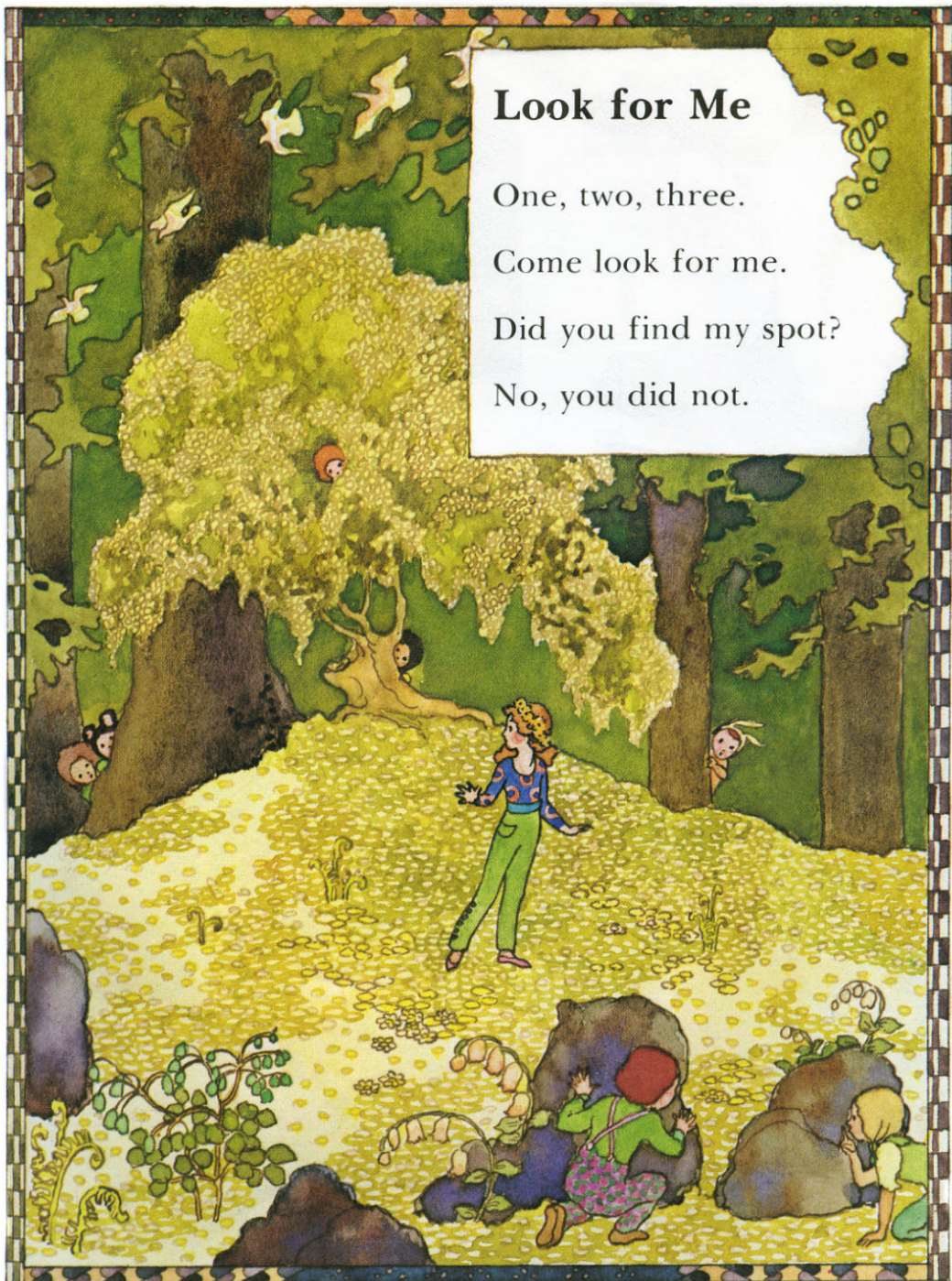
## Look for Me

No, you did not.



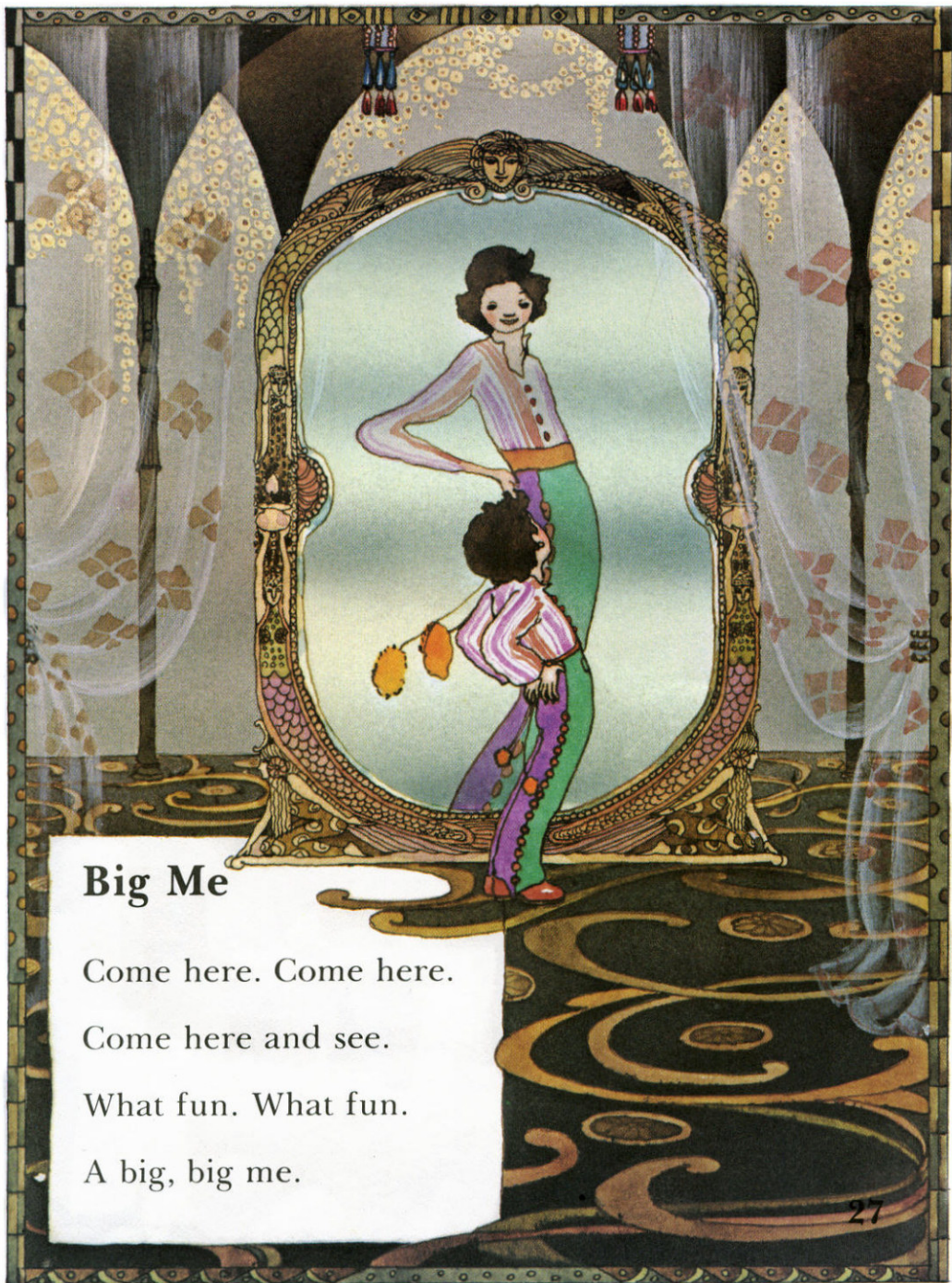


# Cookies
