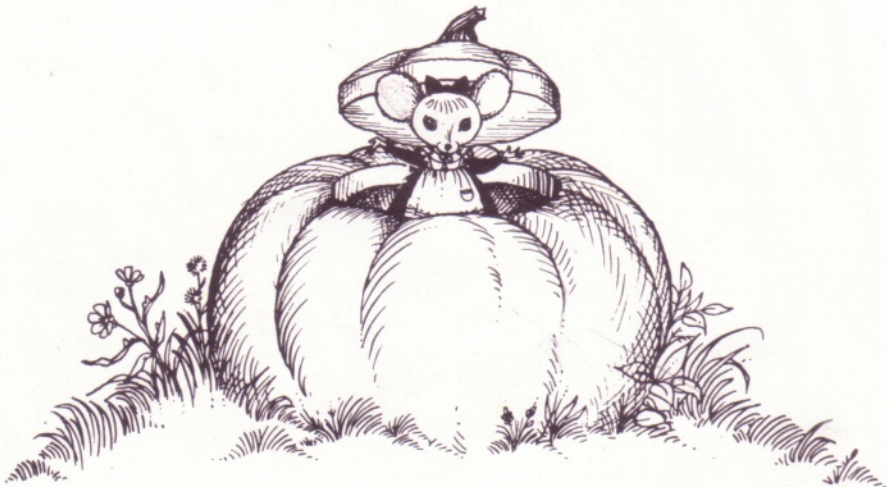

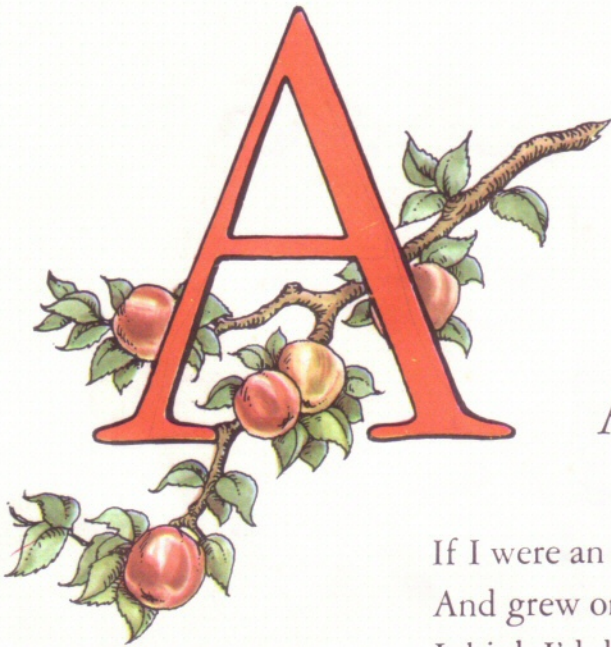

And say, "Eat me, my boy!"

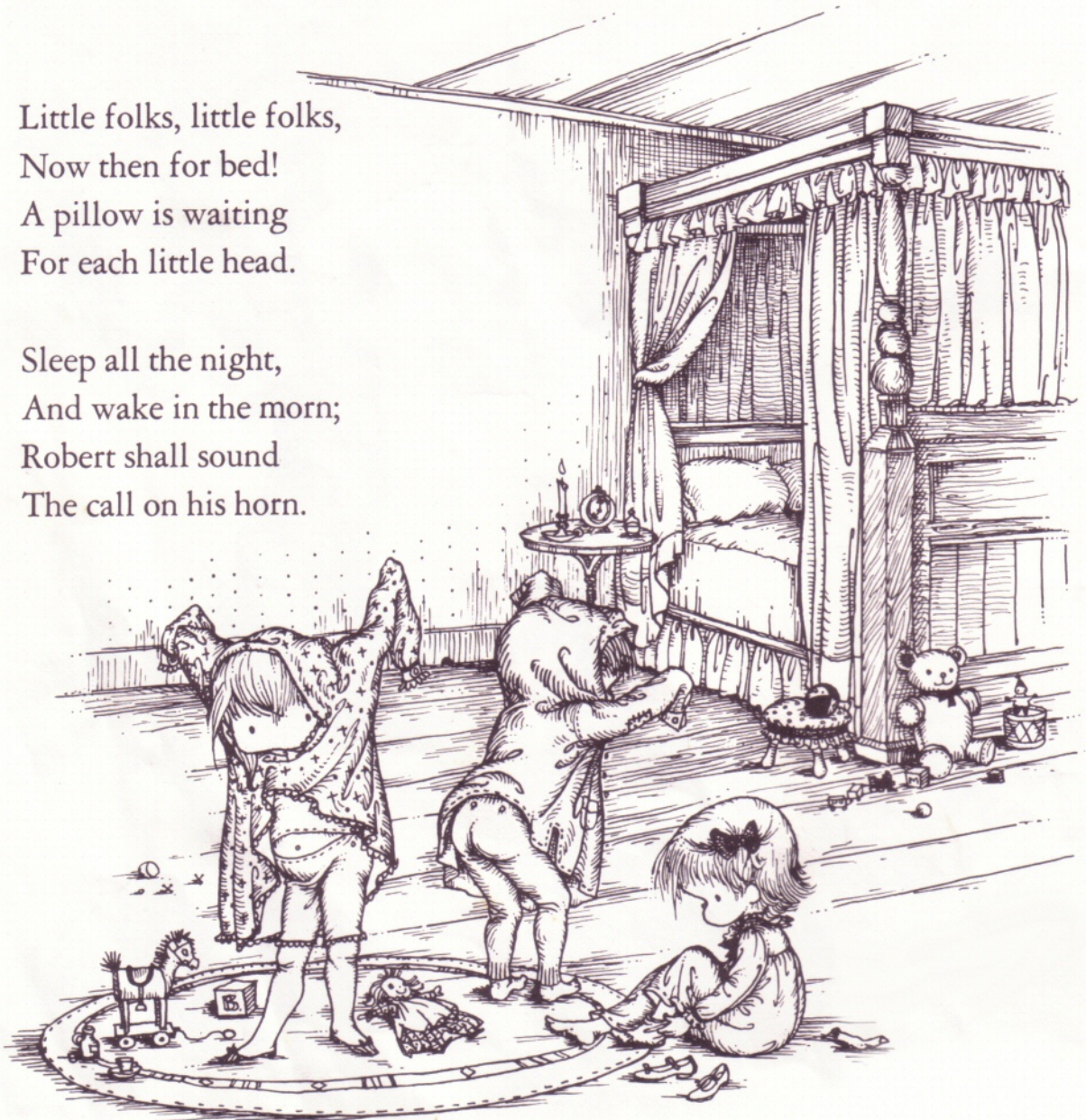




B BED

For each little head.

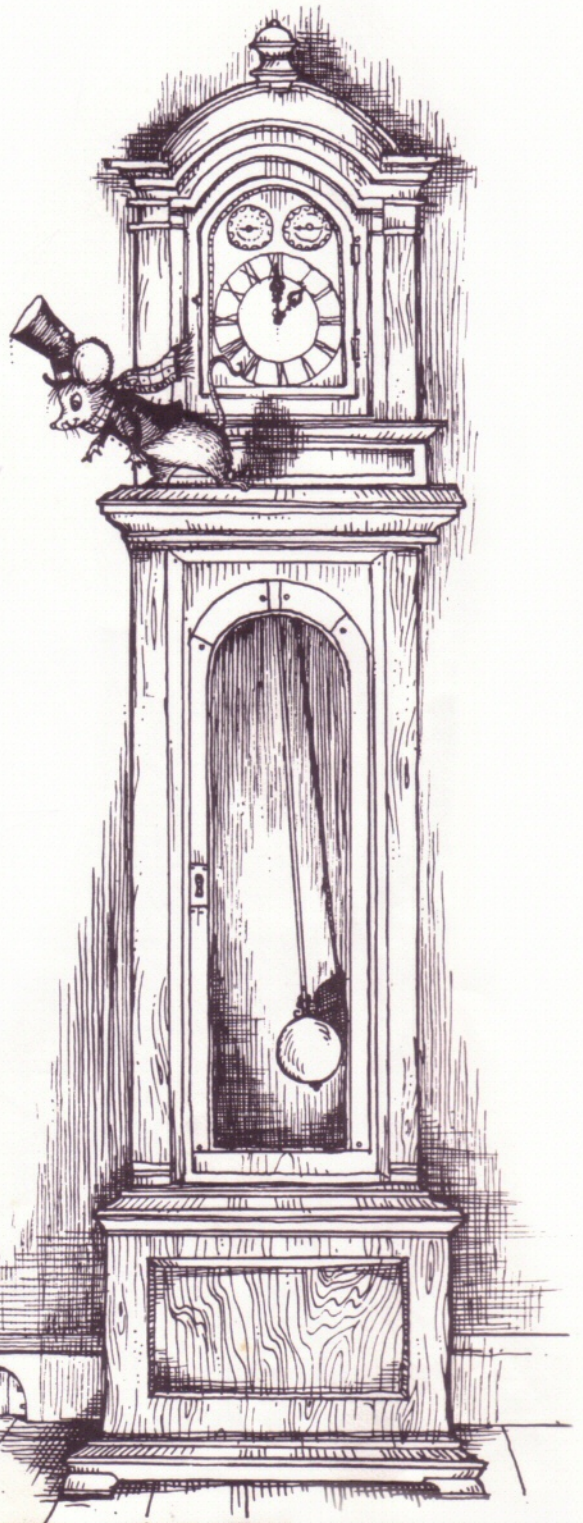
Sleep all the night,

Hickory, dickory, dock.

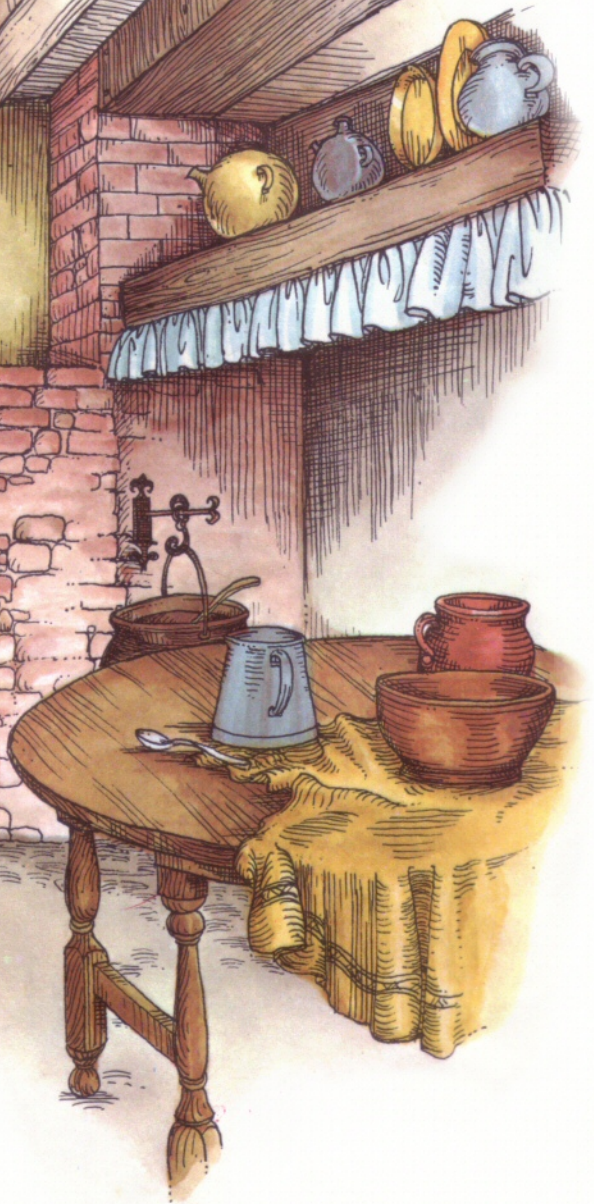

Wealthy and wise.





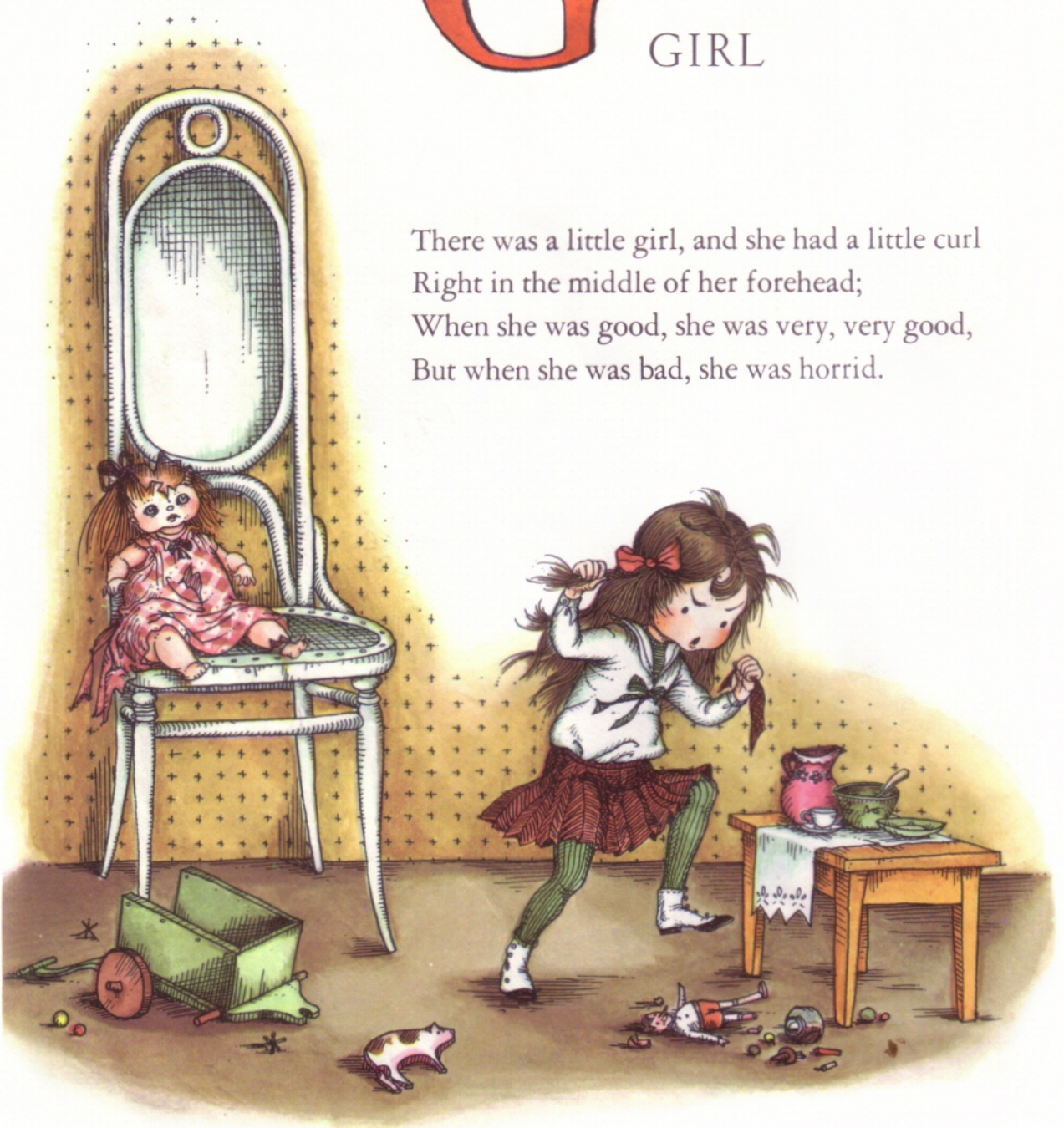

G GIRL

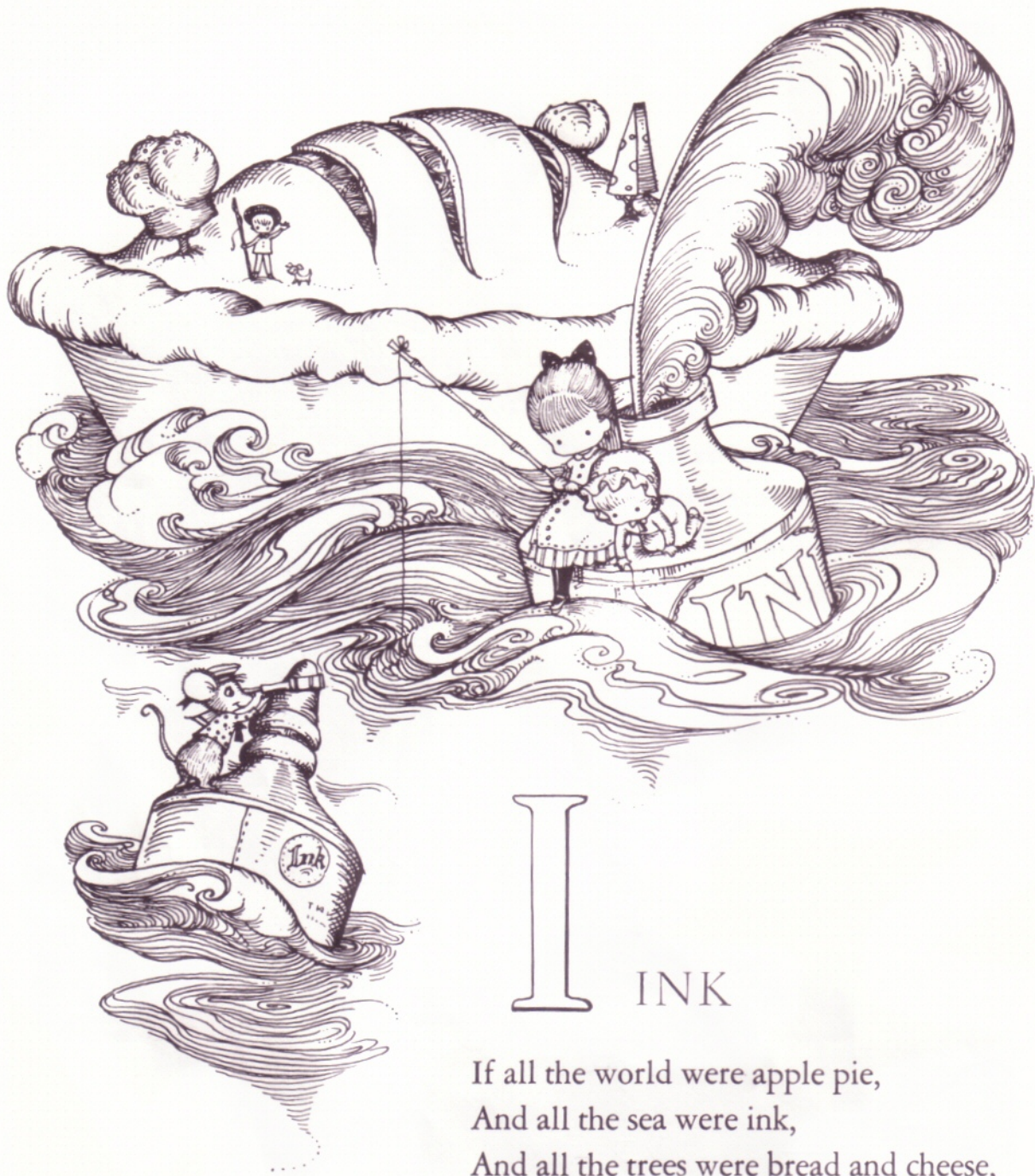
There was a little girl, and she had a little curl

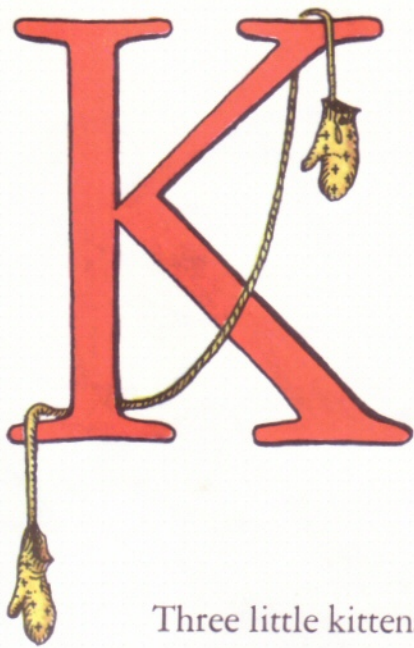
If all the world were apple pie,

L LOVE

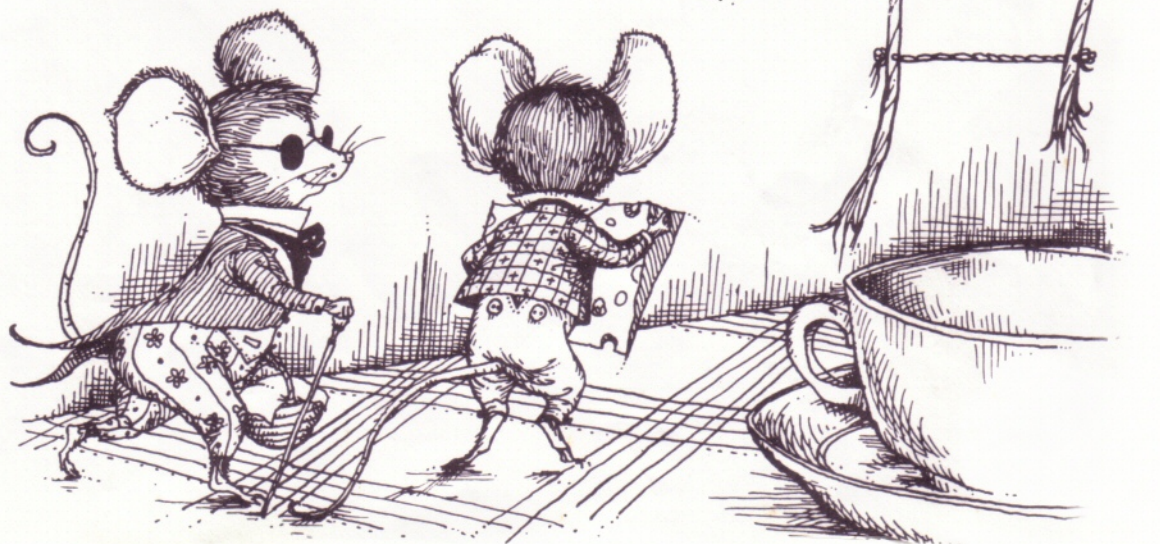
I love you well, my little brother,

As three blind mice?



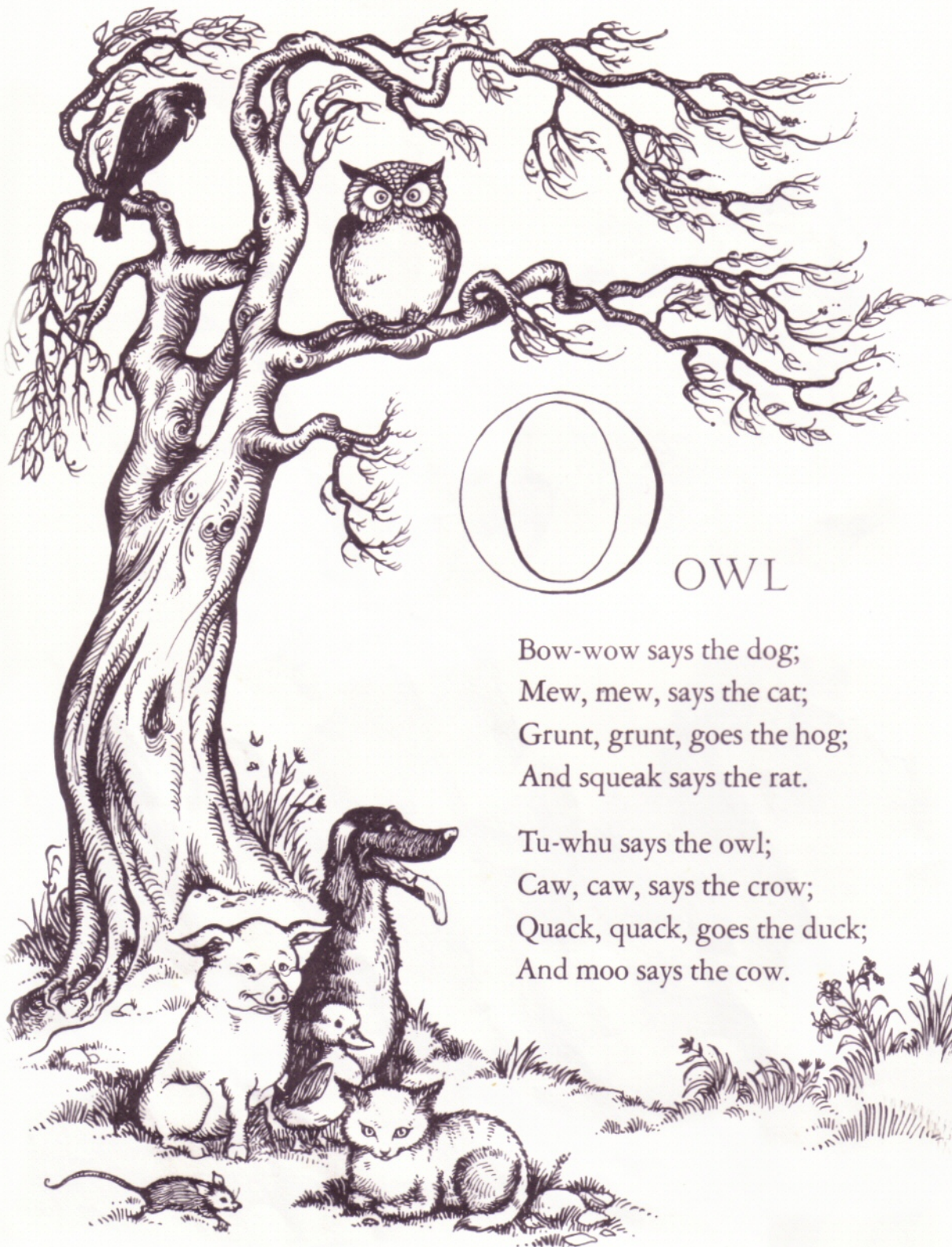

OWL

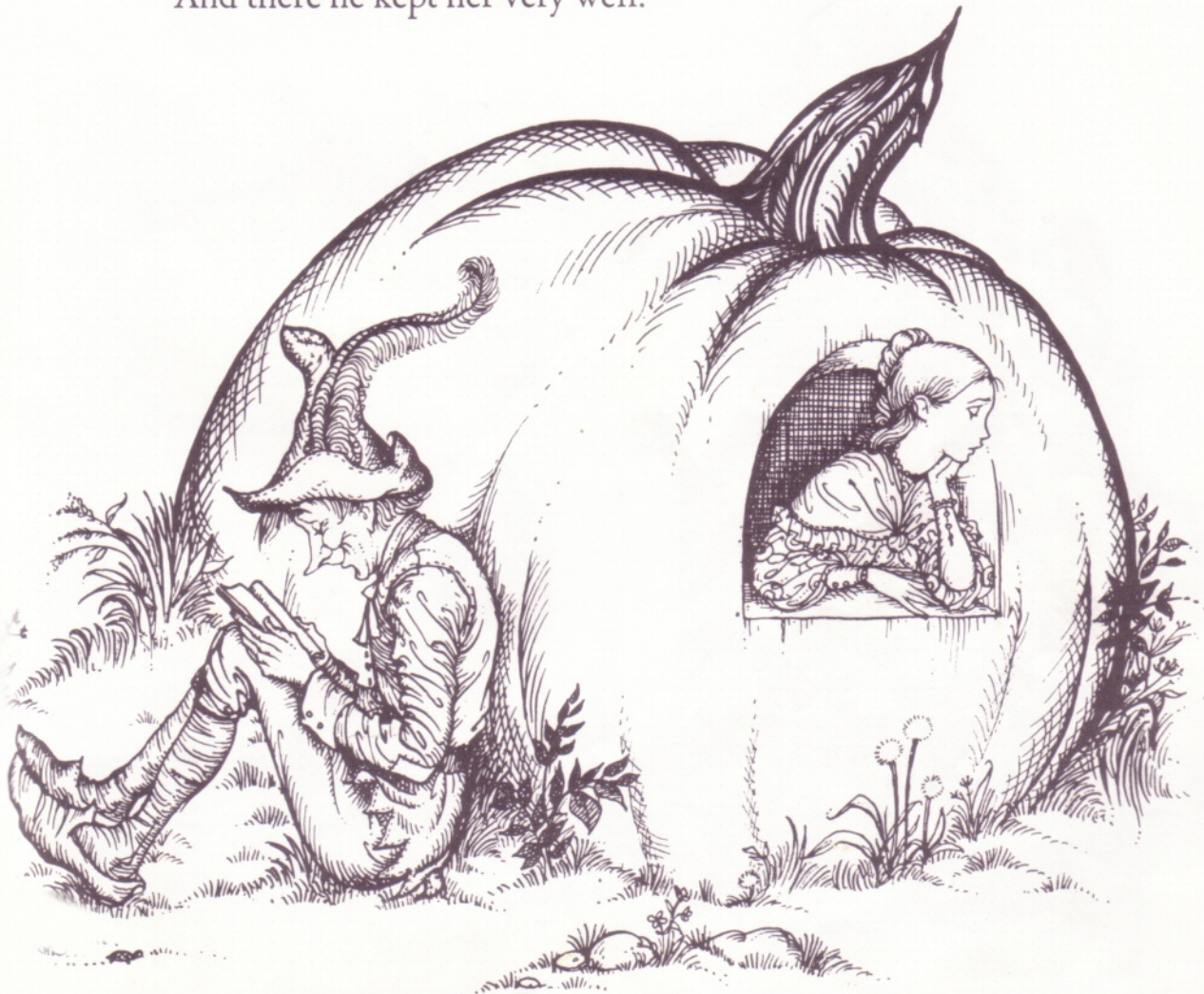
Bow-wow says the dog;

And there he kept her very well.

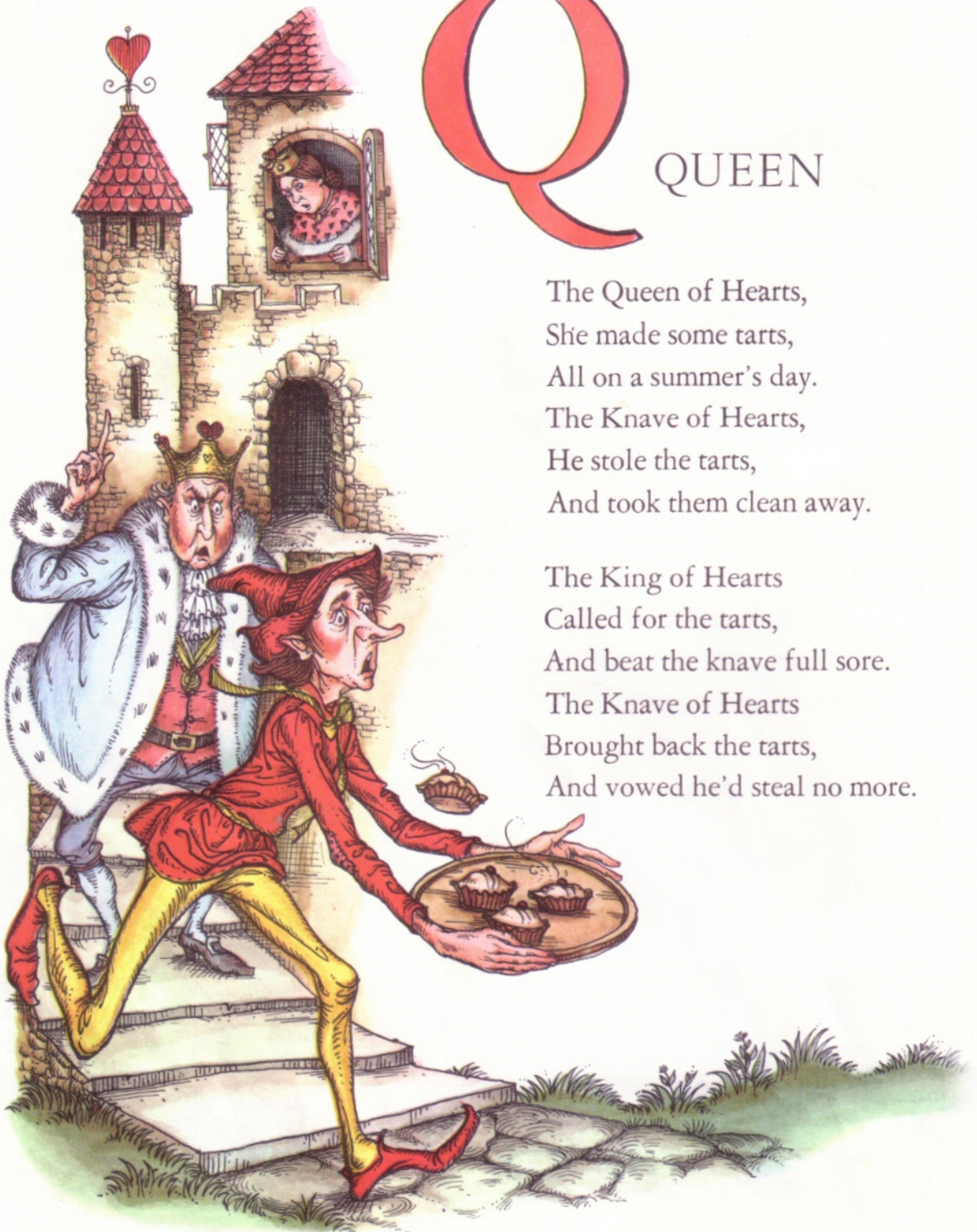

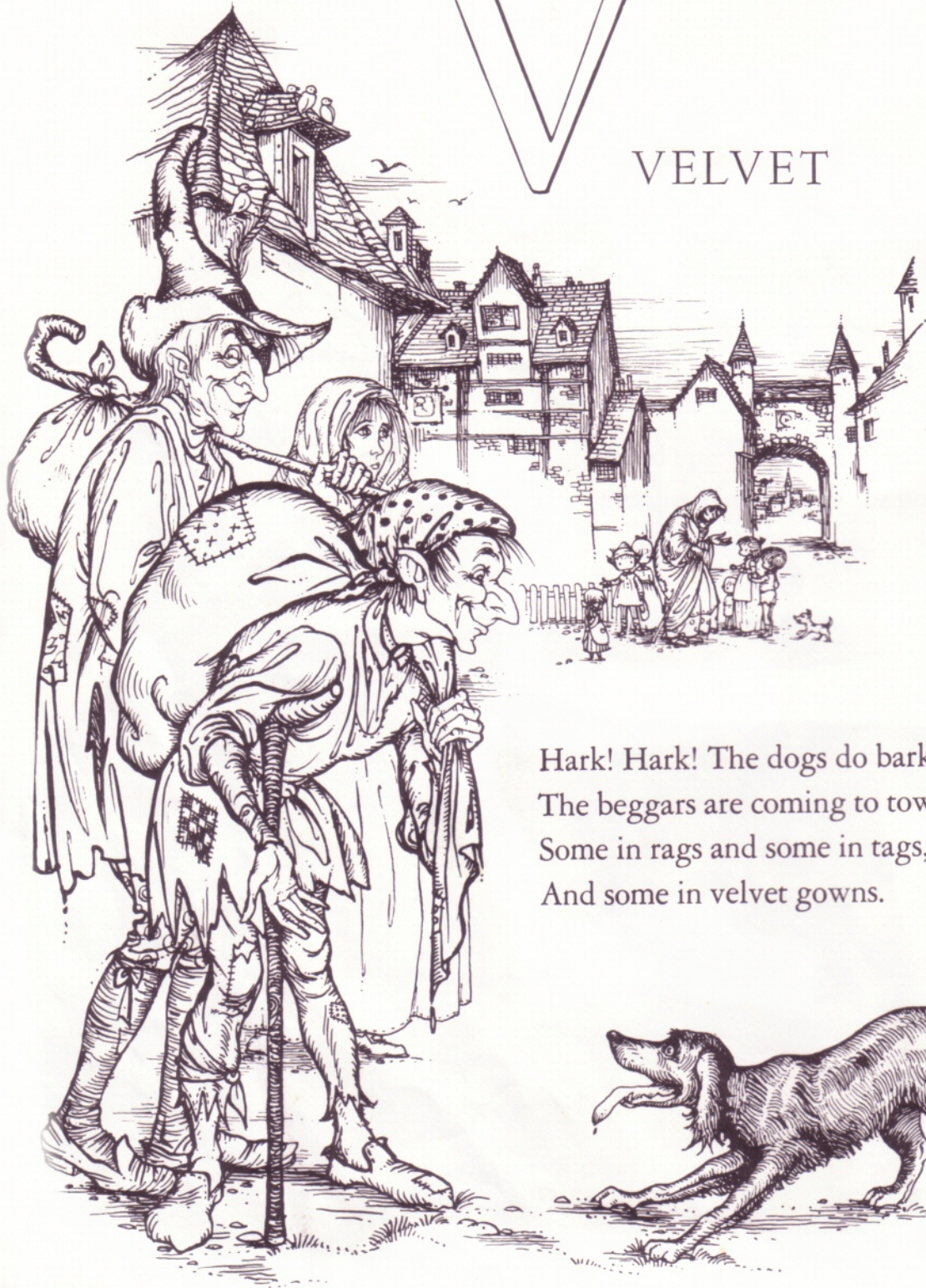
UNICORN

VELVET



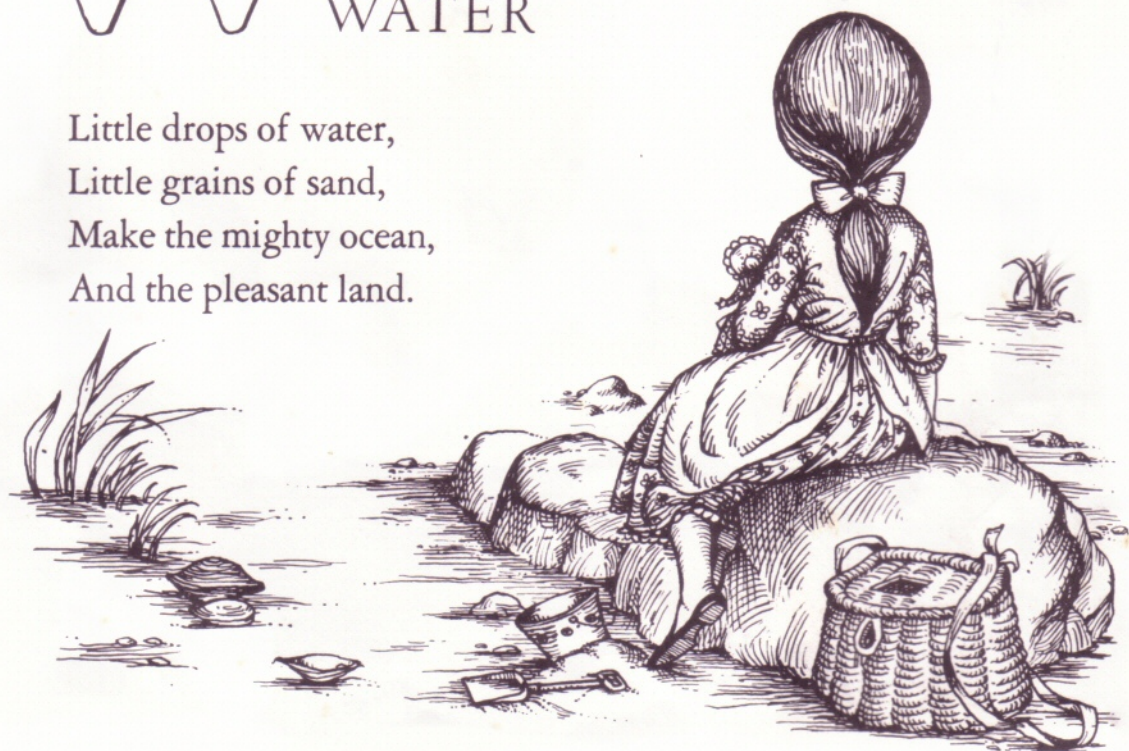
Hark! Hark! The dogs do bark!
