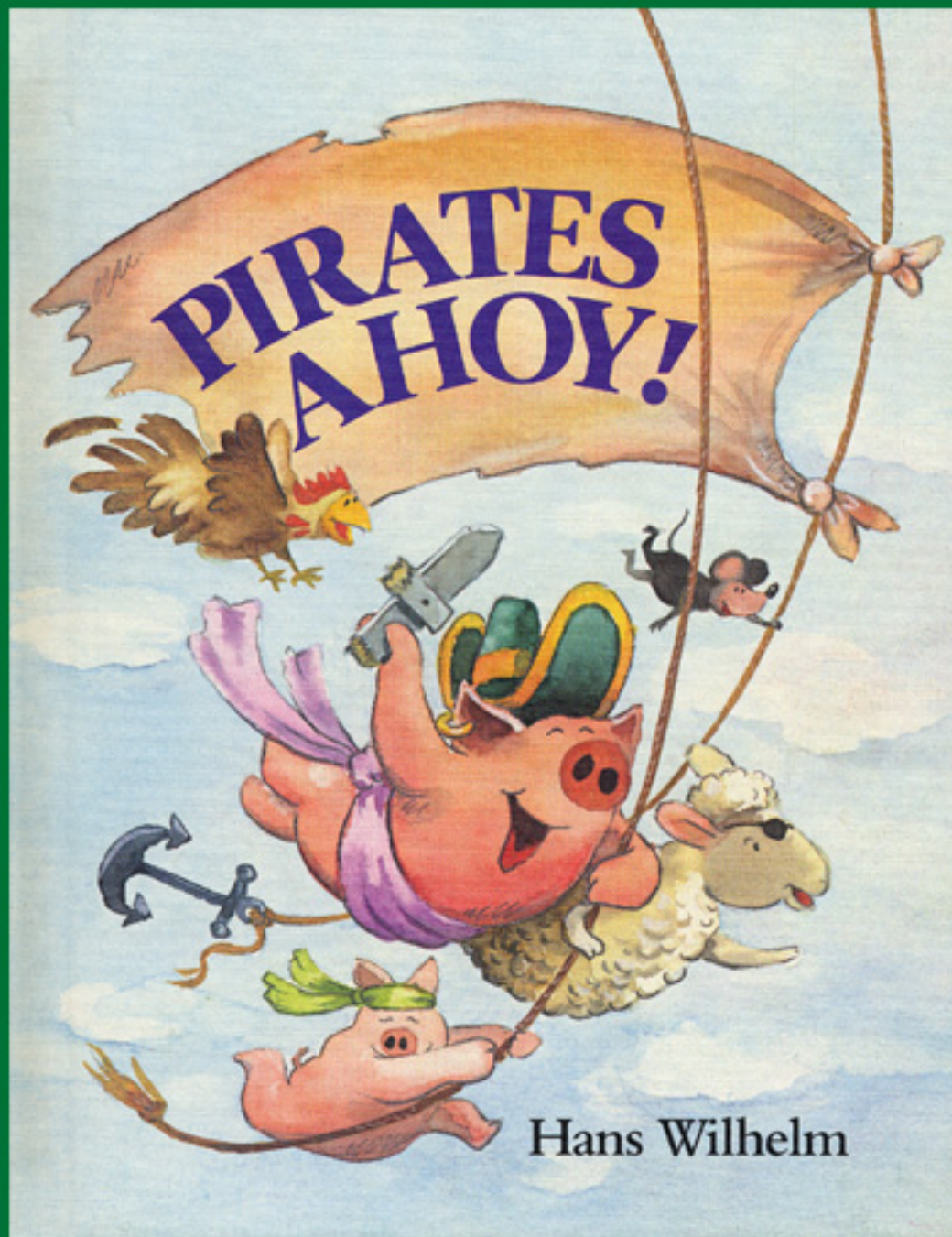

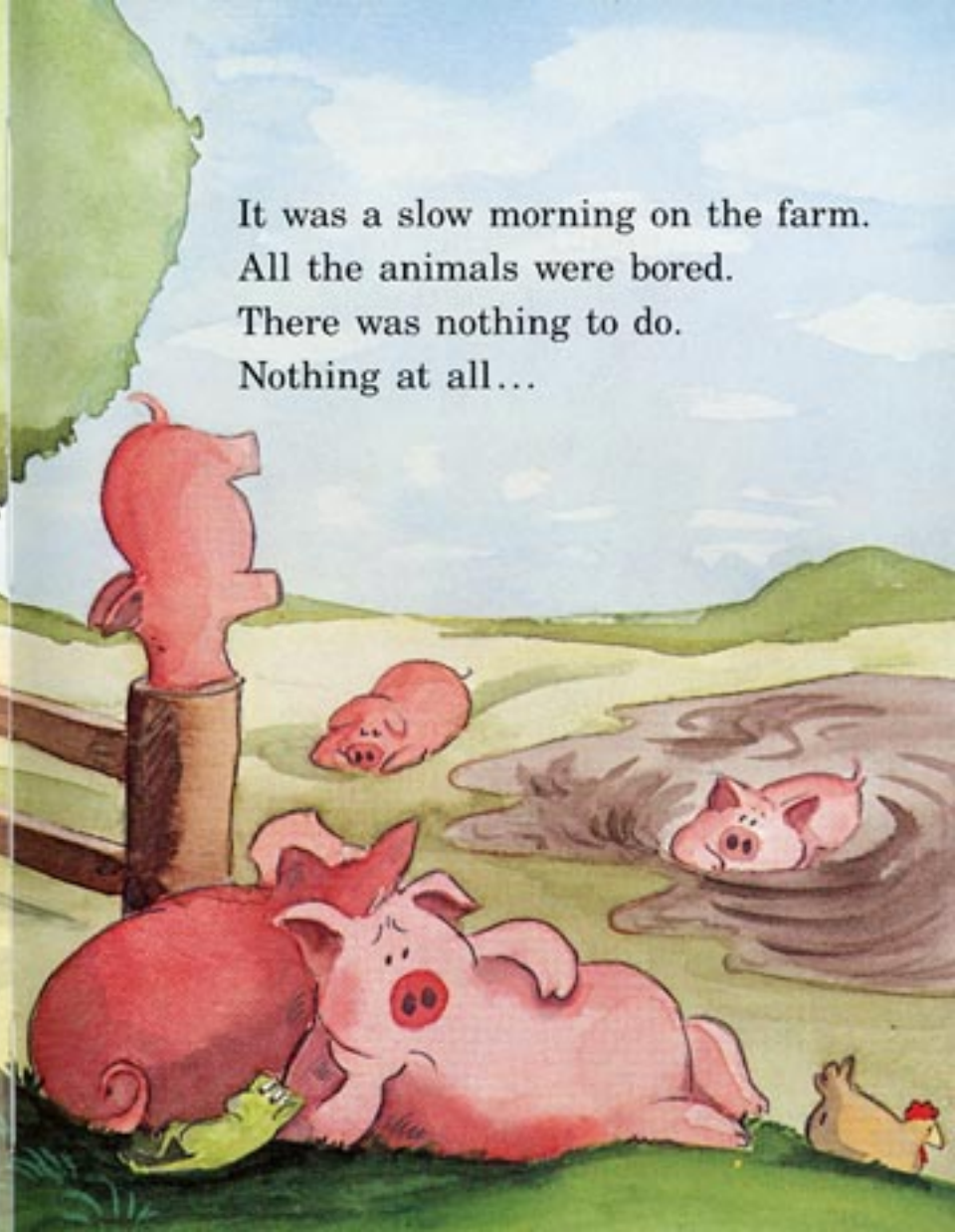

bumbly pirate ship.



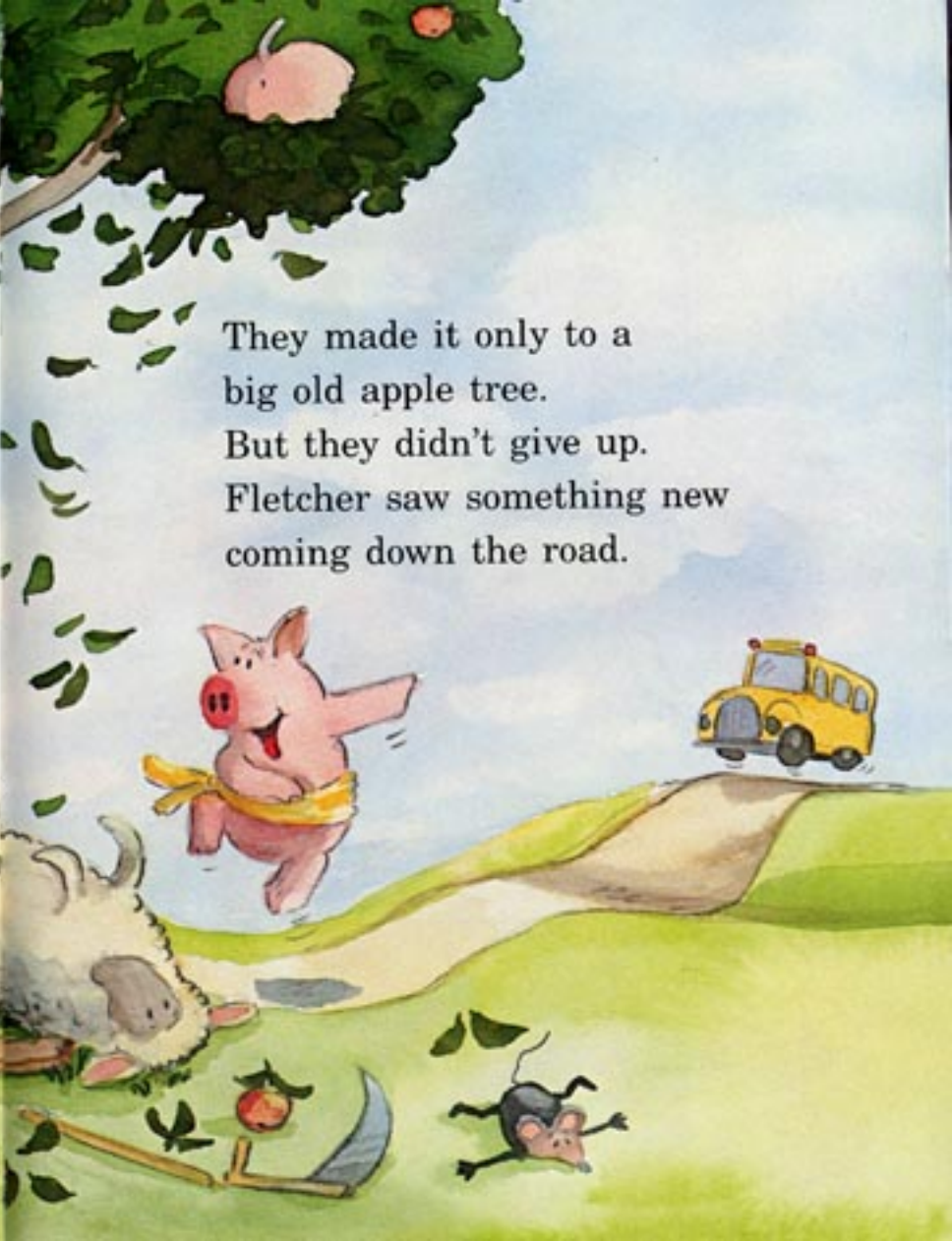


The pirates began to go

bouncy pirate ship.

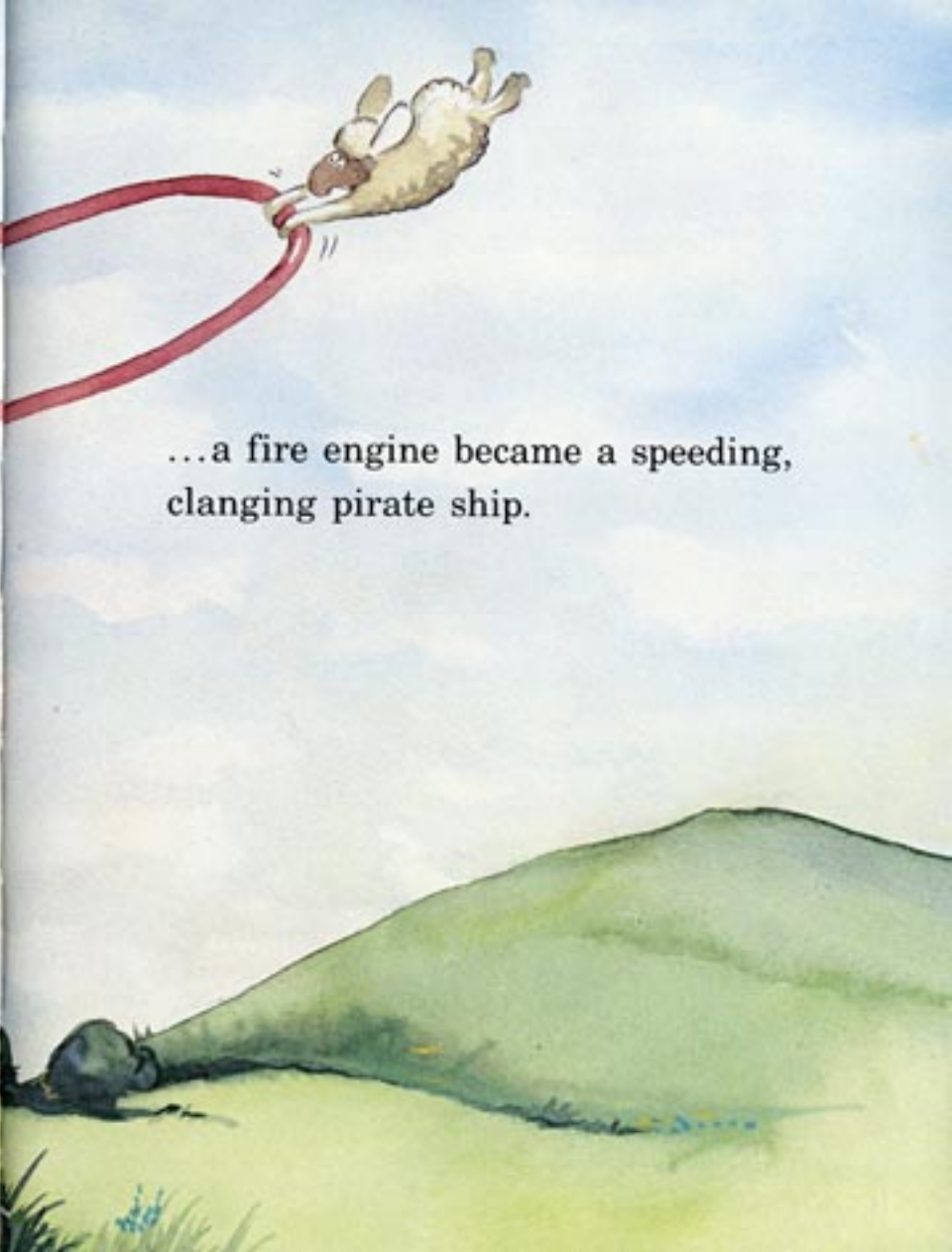
Being a pirate is hard work.

fast enough, so...

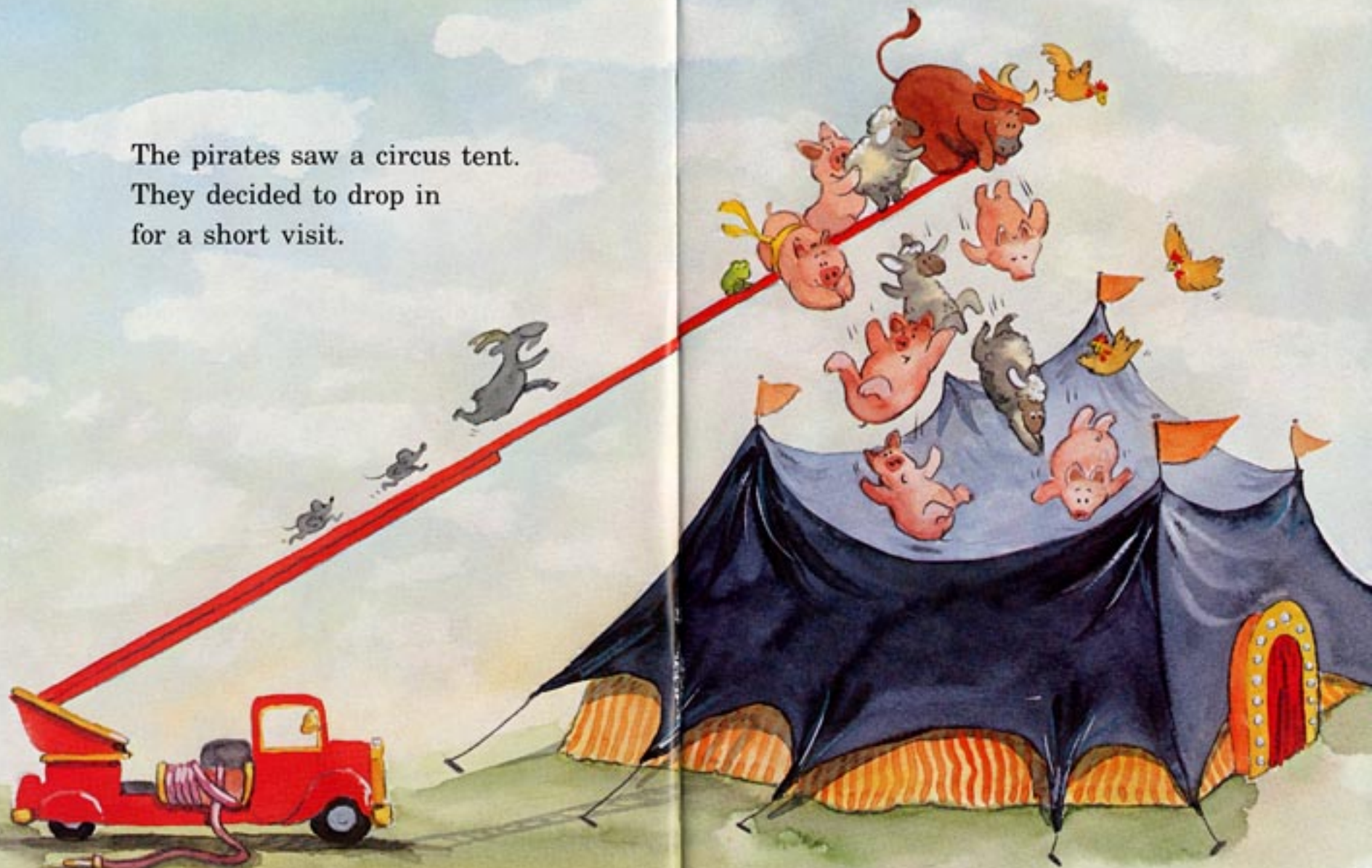




...a fire engine became a speeding,
clanging pirate ship.

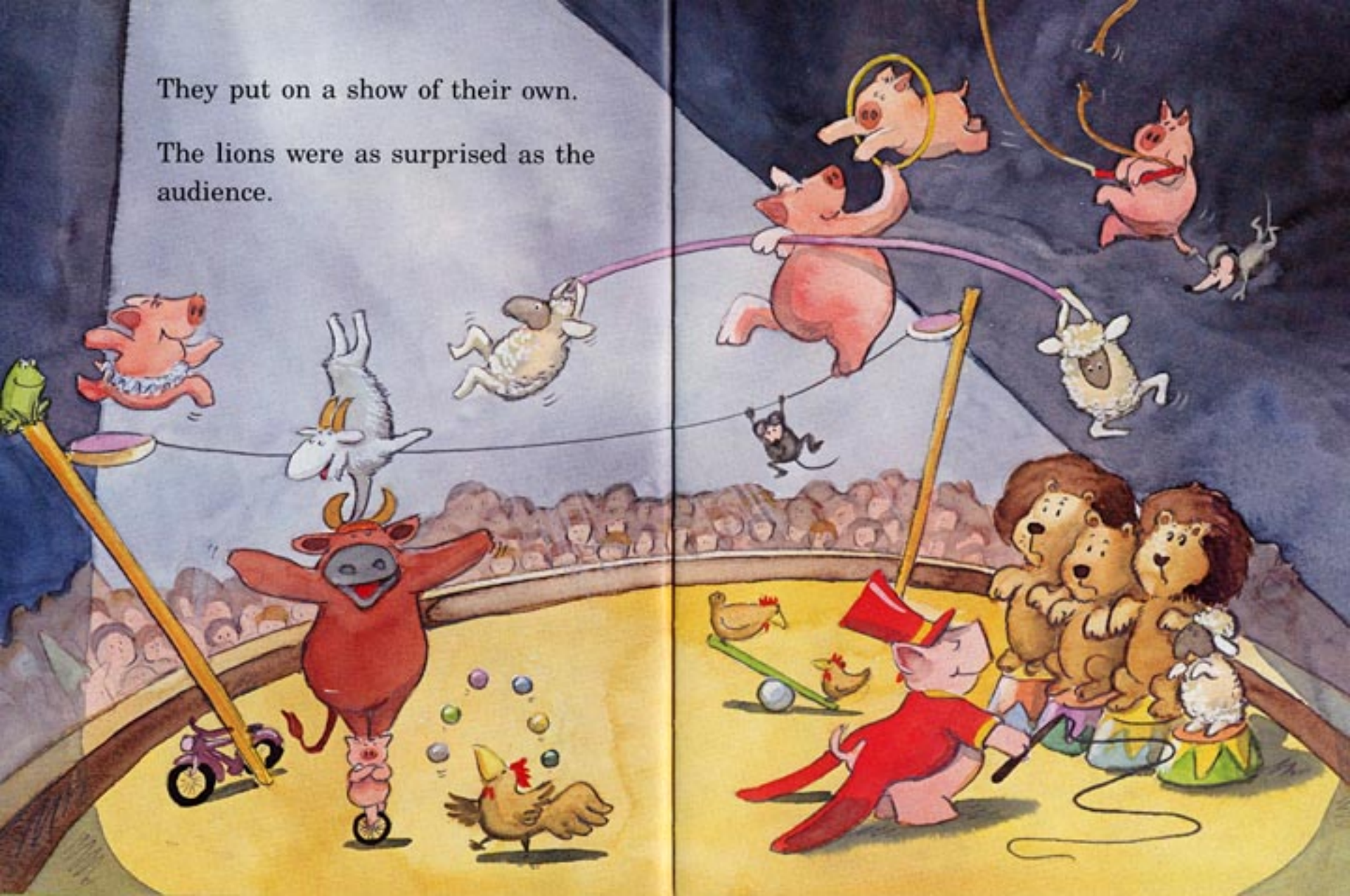


The pirates saw a circus tent.
