

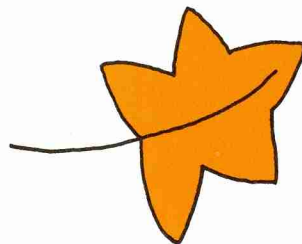

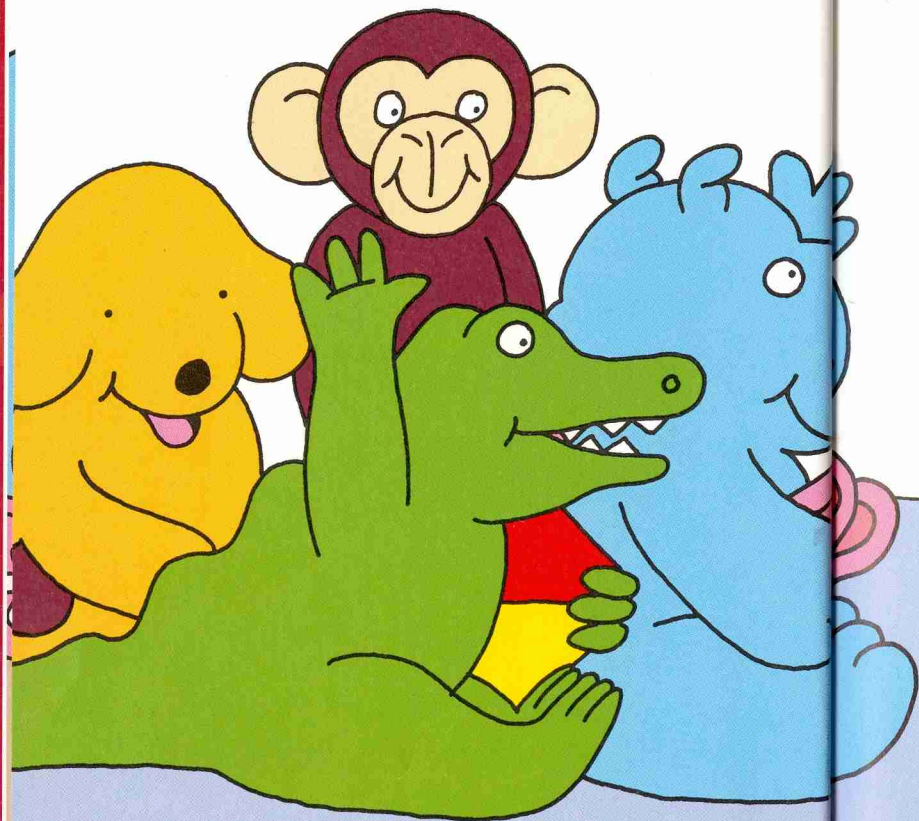
Spot and his friends arrived at school bright and early.

hands up.

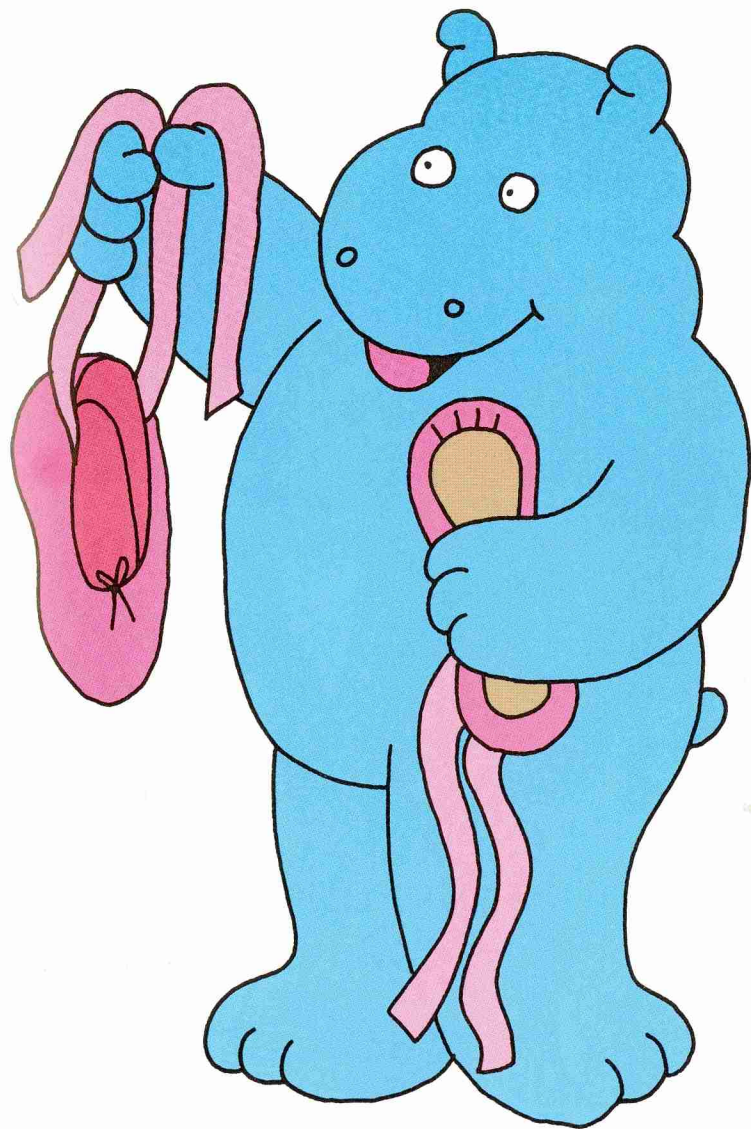


Miss Bear asked Helen to come up first.

Helen held up her pink ballet shoes for everyone to see. They had lovely ribbons to keep them on her feet.

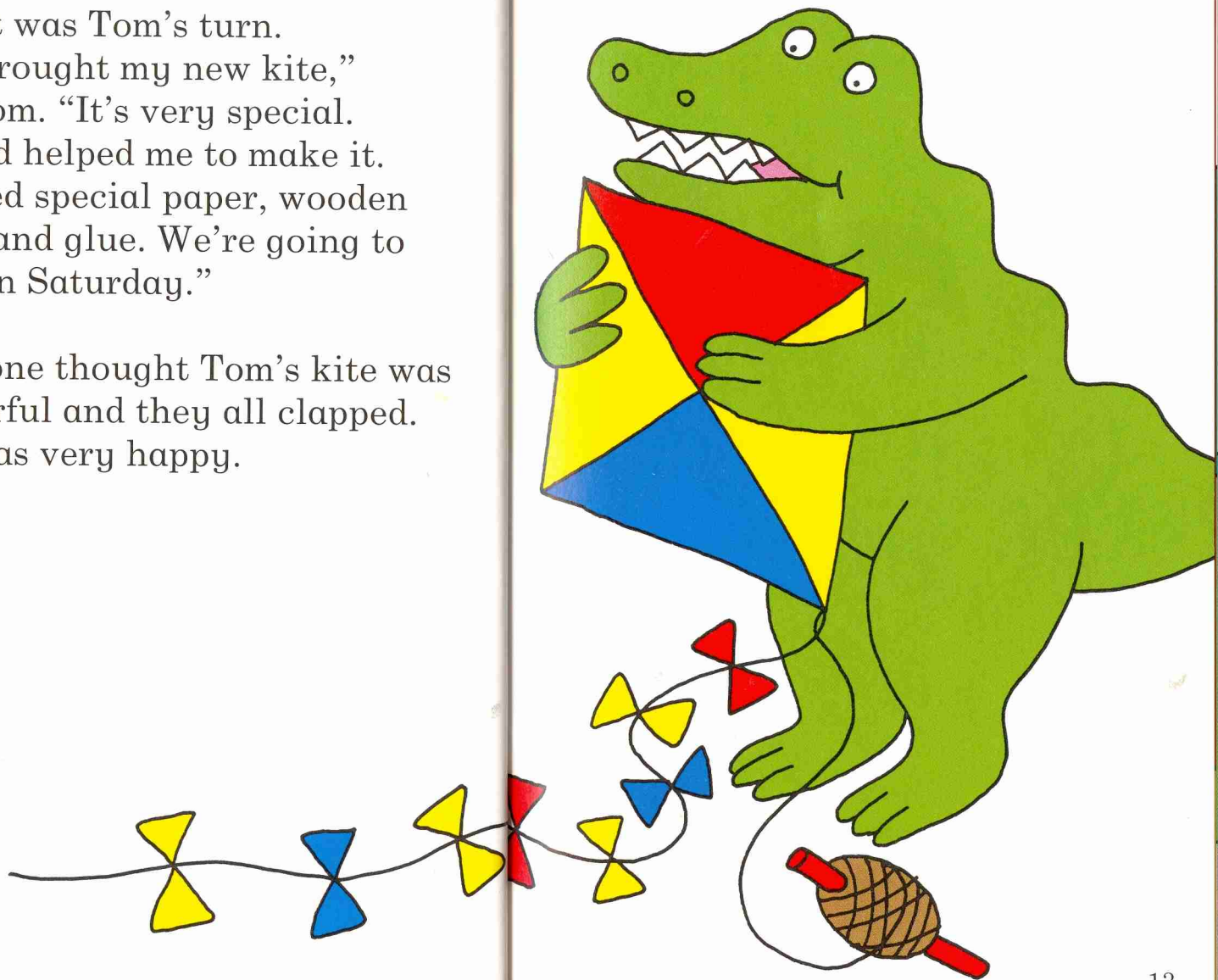
“Every week I go to ballet class,” said Helen. “Next week we’re doing a concert and I’m going to be a flower!”

Everyone thought Helen’s ballet shoes were very special. They all clapped. Helen was very happy.

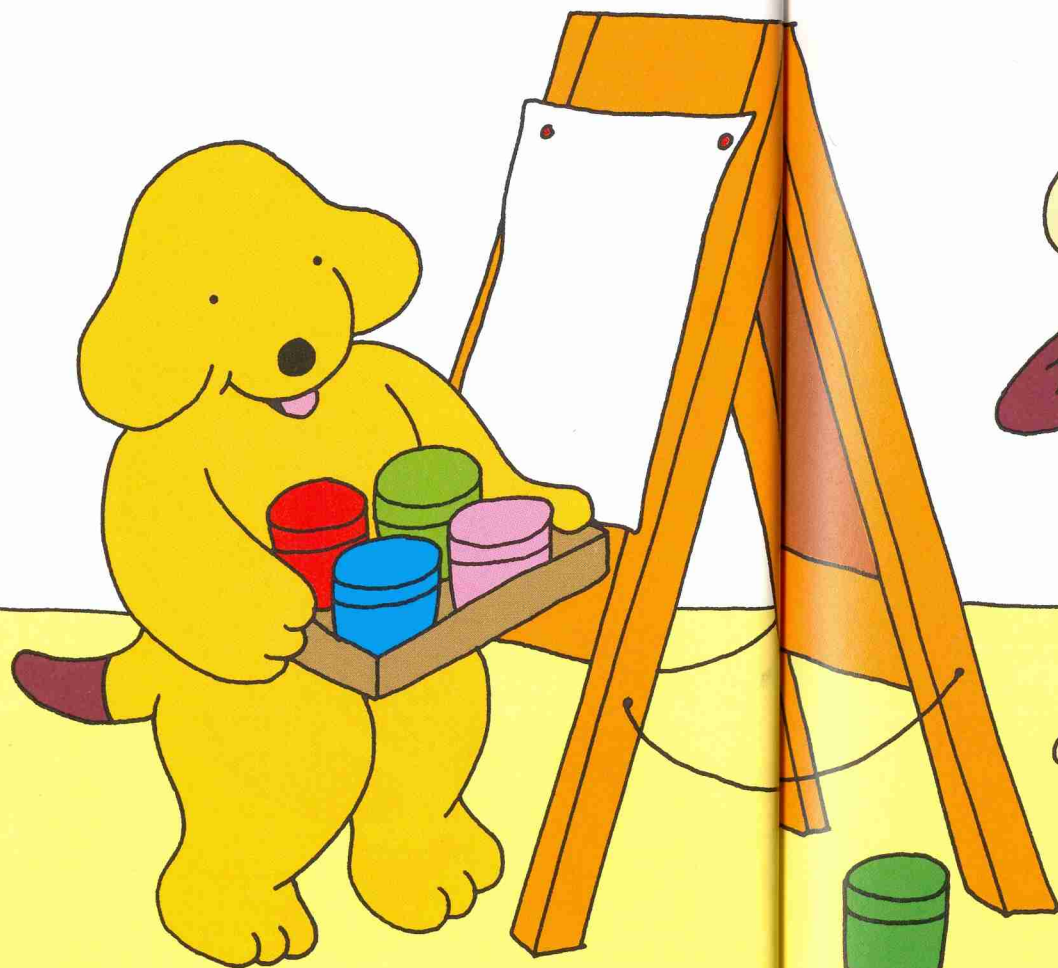


Next it was Tom's turn.

Later that morning, it was time for painting. Spot and Steve shared an easel.

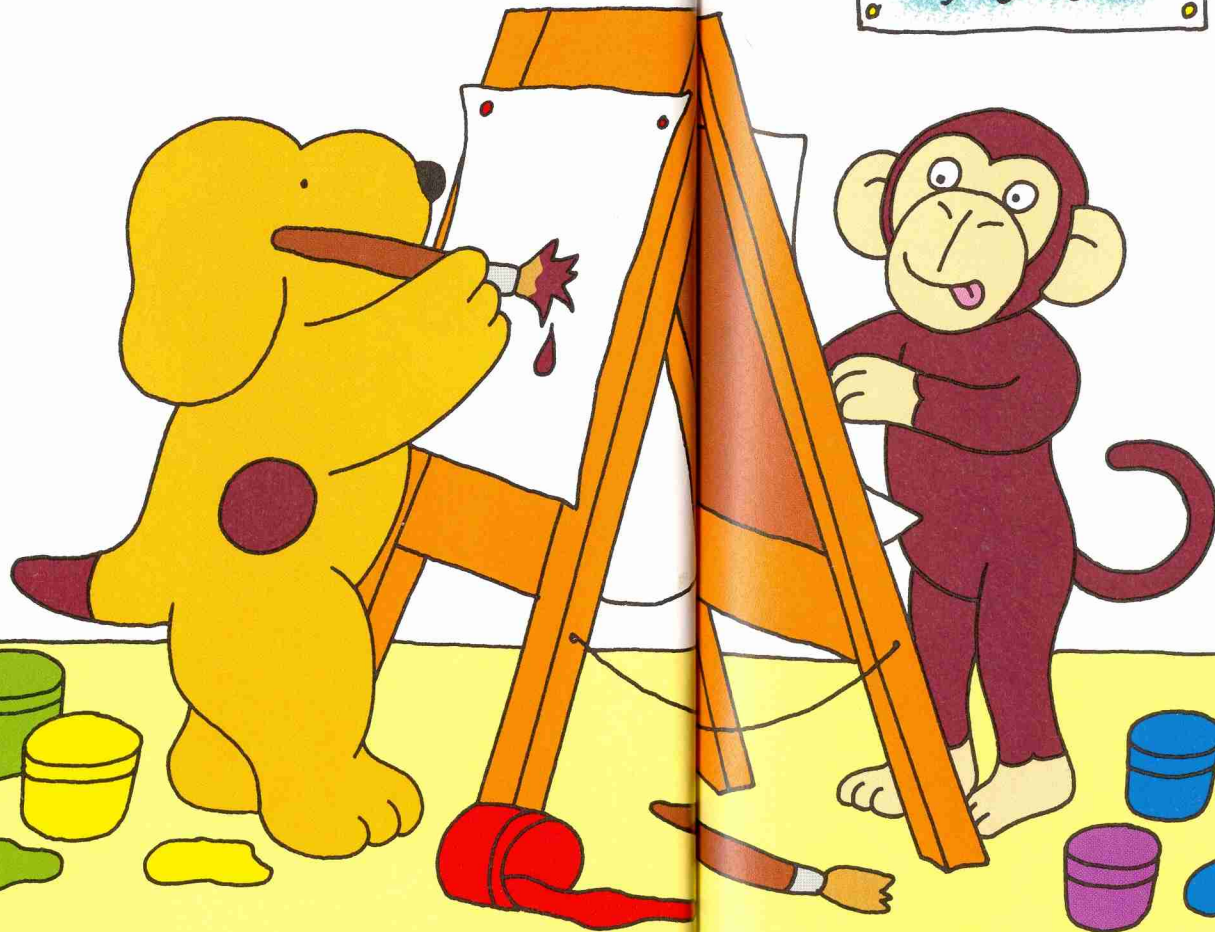
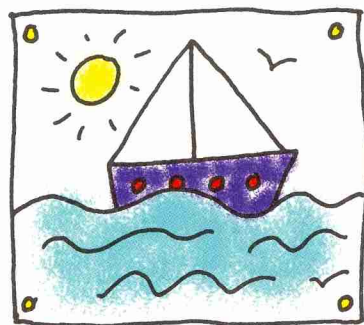


“I’m going to bring something for Show and Tell tomorrow,” said Spot.

That afternoon, Steve was going to Spot's house to play. Sally picked Spot and Steve up and they all walked home together.

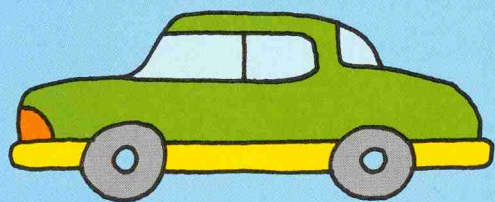
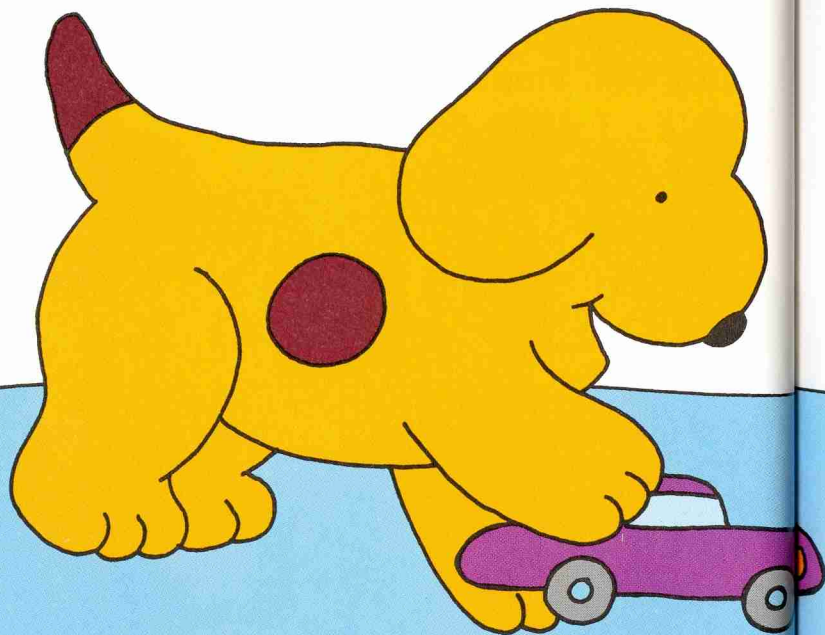
Steve saw a bright orange autumn leaf on the grass and he picked it up.

"It's a lovely colour!"

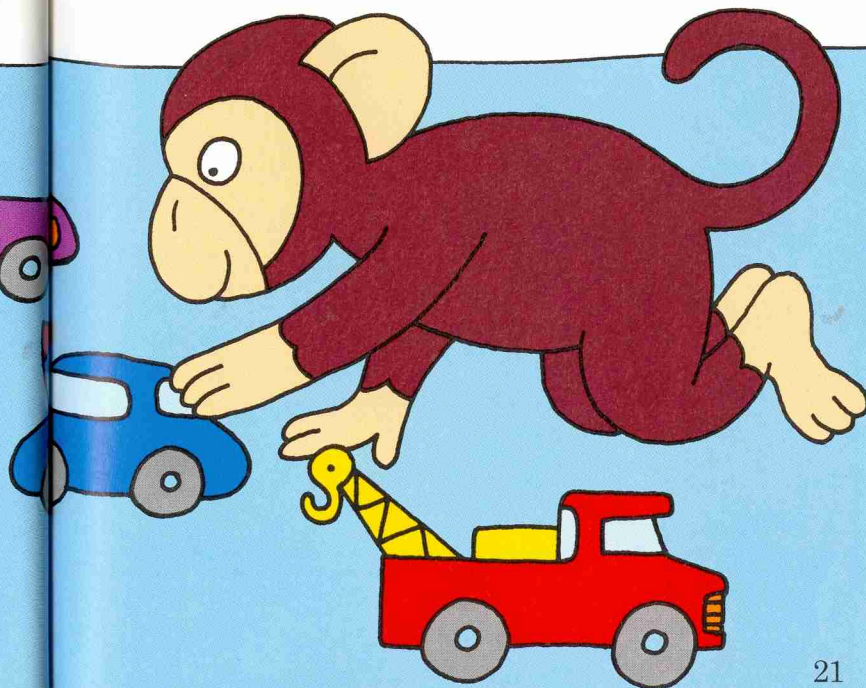


When they got back, Spot and Steve played cars in Spot's room.



"My car collection is special," Spot said to Steve. "Maybe I'll take my cars to Show and Tell tomorrow."

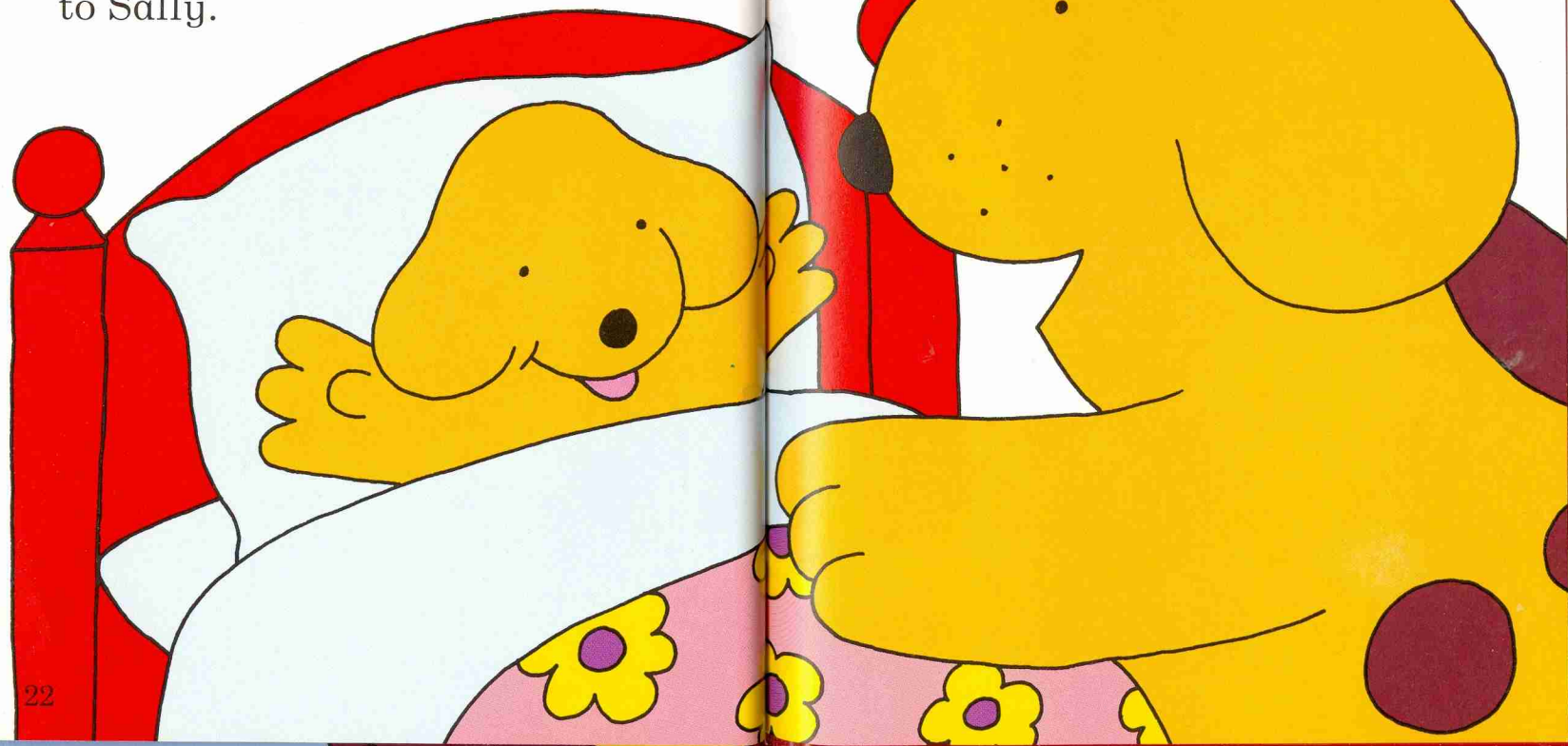
"That's a good idea," said Steve.

"That sounds perfect!" said Sally, and she kissed Spot goodnight. "Sweet dreams, Spot!"



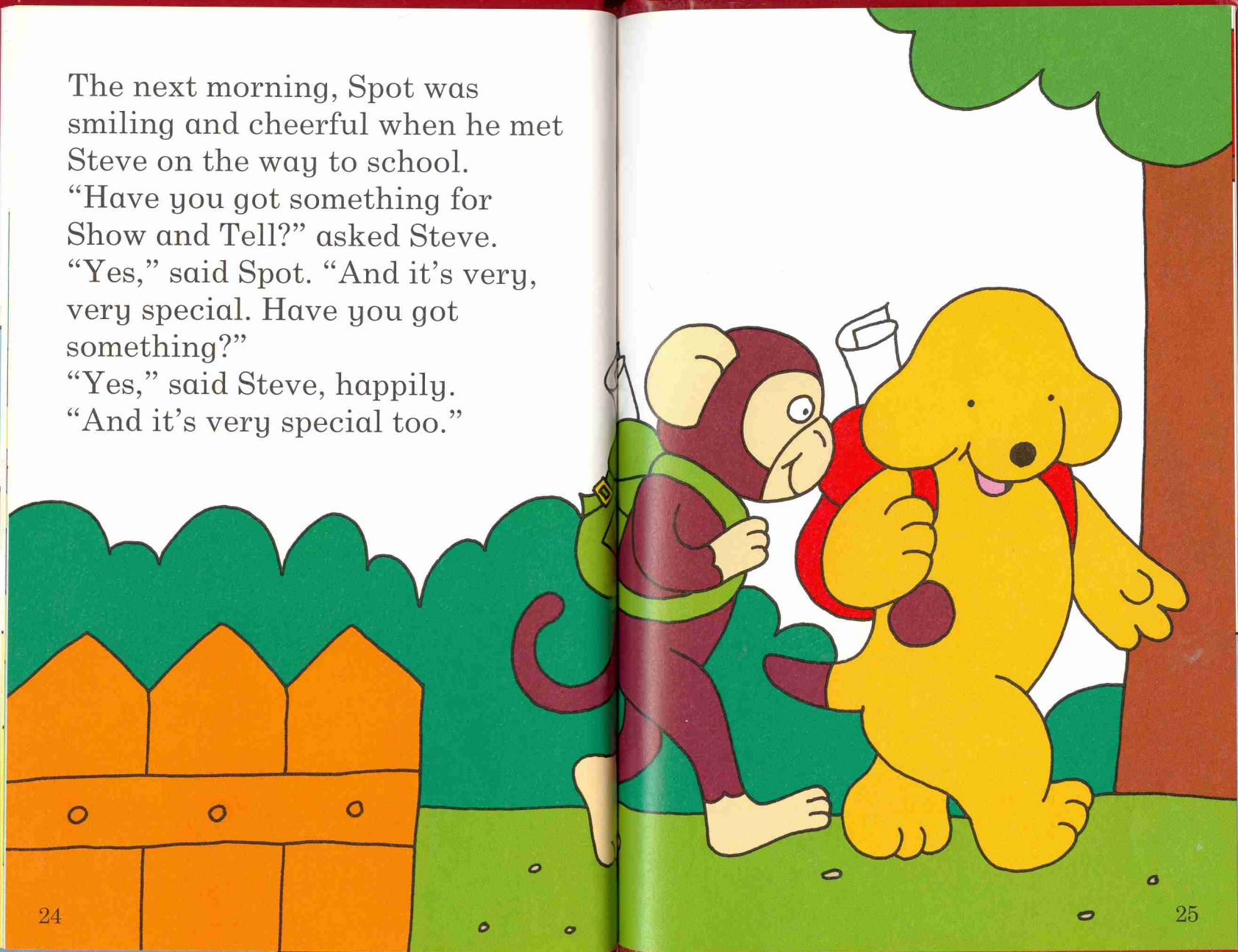
The next morning, Spot was smiling and cheerful when he met Steve on the way to school.

“Yes,” said Spot. “And it’s very, very special. Have you got something?”

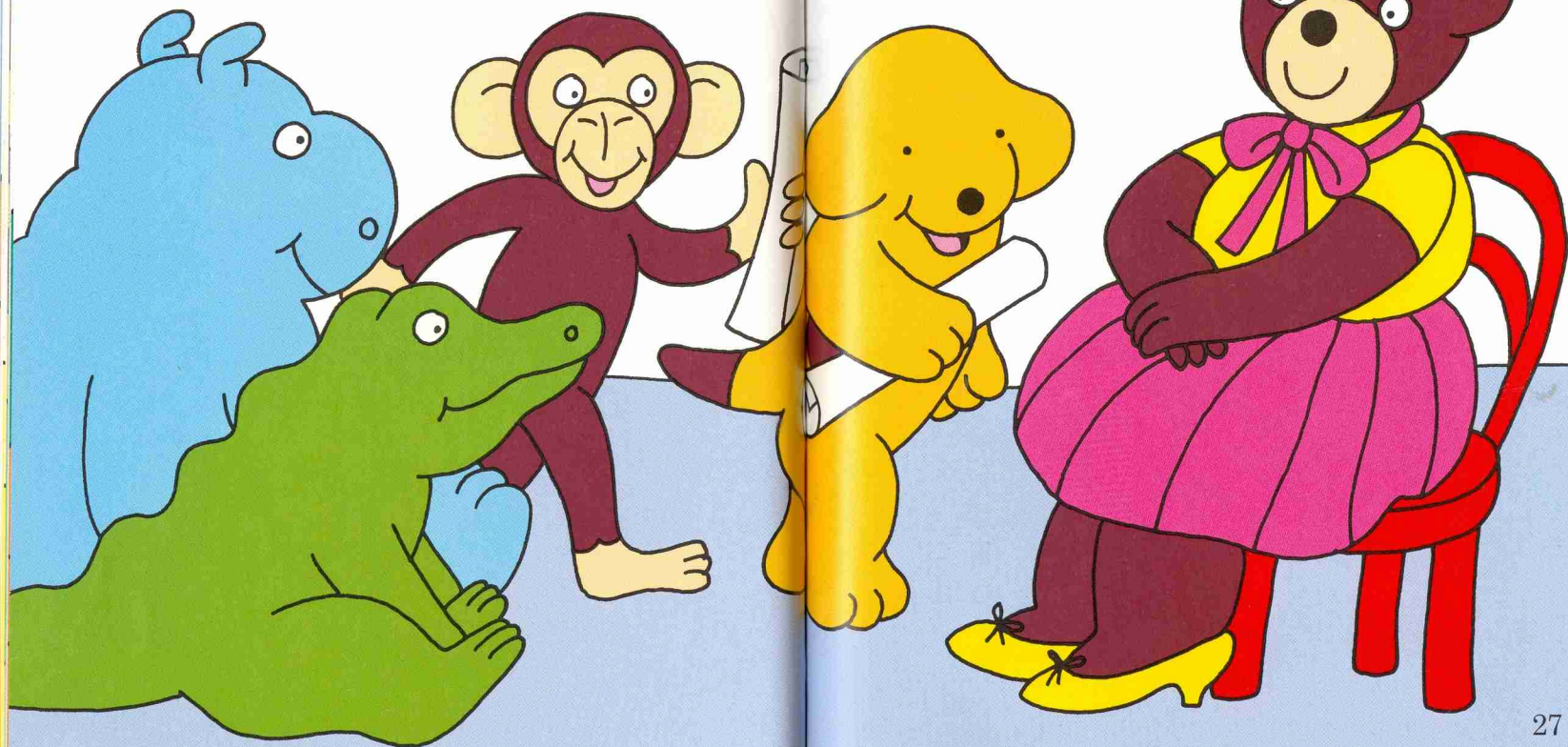
“Yes,” said Steve, happily.

At school, Miss Bear asked if anyone had brought something special for Show and Tell.

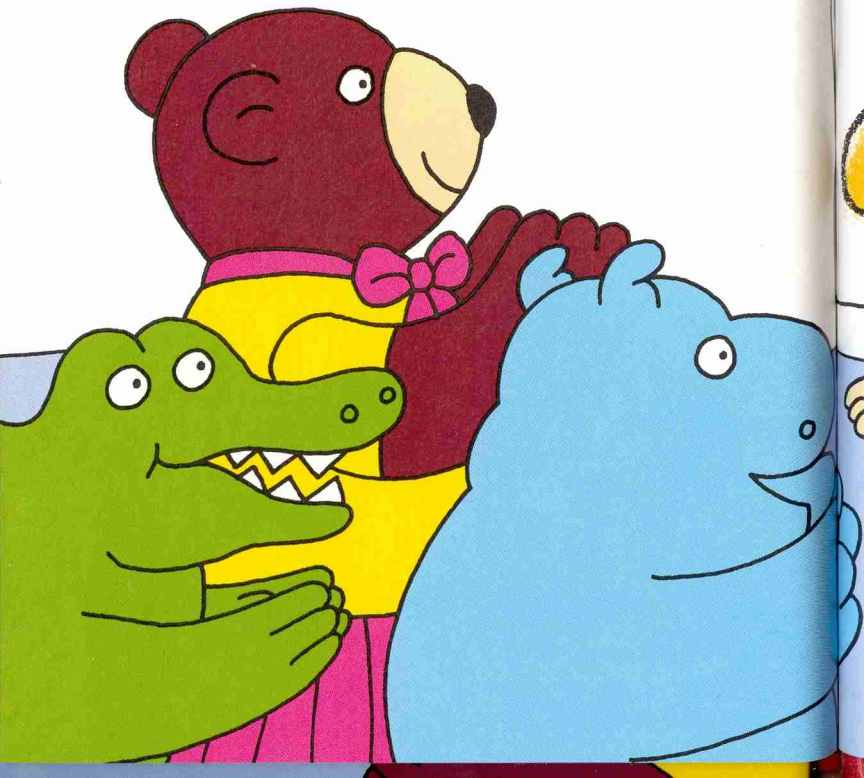
Spot and Steve put their hands up and Miss Bear asked them to come to the front of the class.



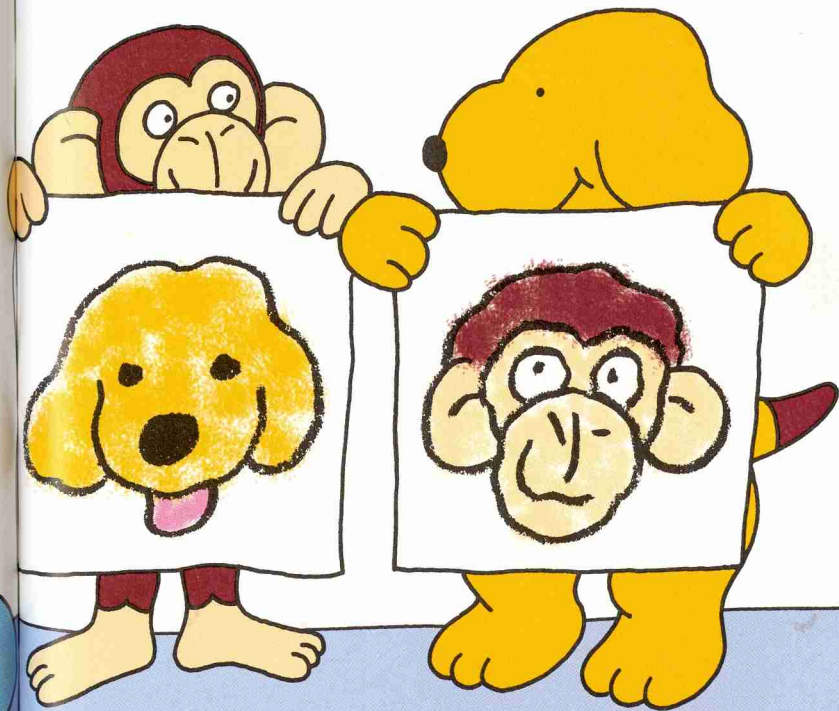
“I’d like to show the picture I painted of my friend Spot!” said Steve.
