Next, Laurel decided to visit the ancient sorcerer. She climbed up to the castle tower. Even before she knocked, the sorcerer had answered the door.

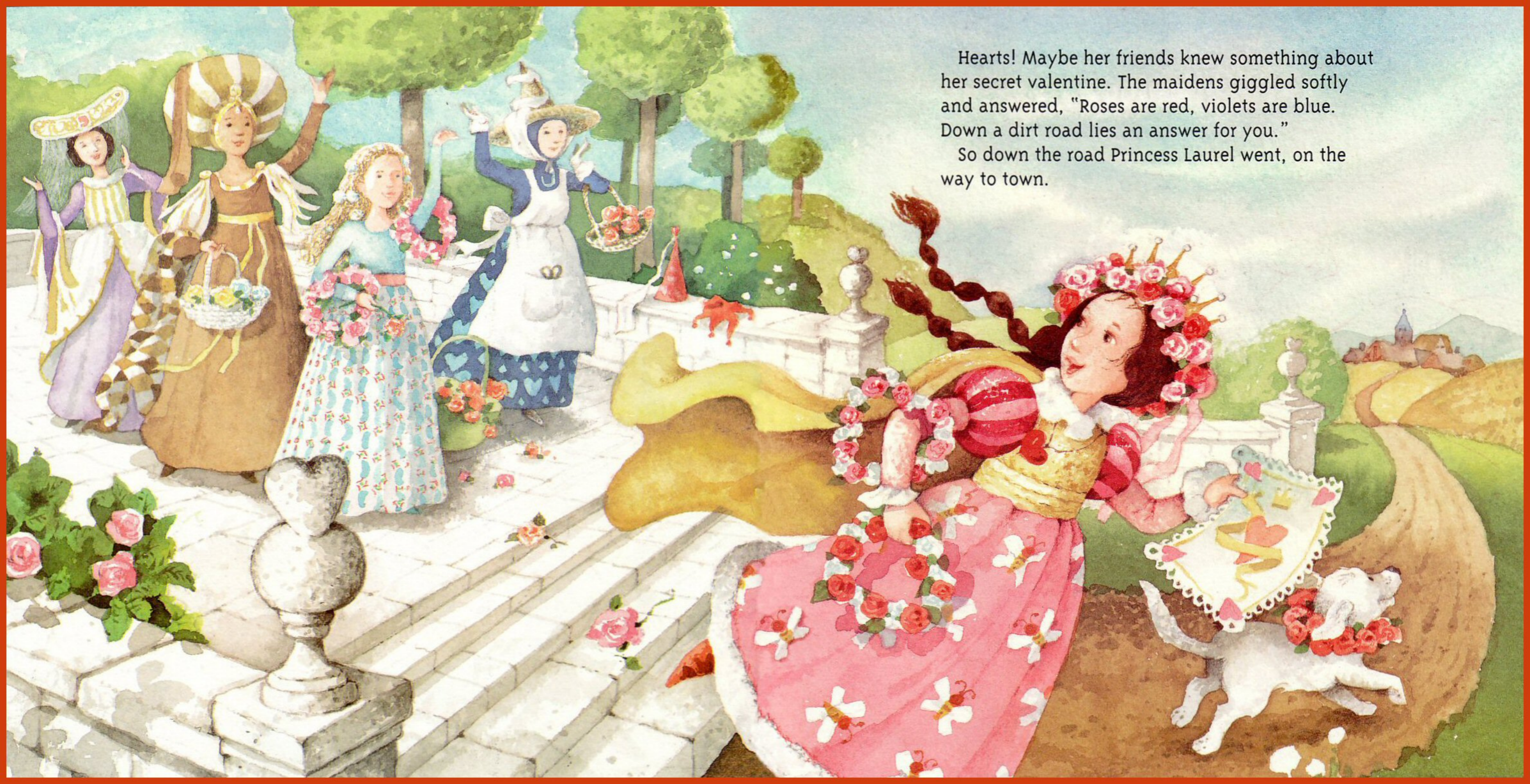
“Well, hello Princess Laurel. Something tells me you are here to find your secret valentine. Come, let’s take a look in my crystal ball.”
